Ramon and Deborah Carrasquillo



Thought for February

When you go to communion it's important that you be aware that Jesus is really physically present in your body for about 20 minutes (Until the host ceases to be wheat and digestion starts to change it to muscle or energy or whatever your body needs at the time.) But you must prepare for Him

St Catherine gave a good example of communion. Think of your soul as an unlit candle. Think of Christ as a lit candle coming to light your candle with the flame of love, peace and strength. If the wick of your candle is wet with mortal sin then Christ can't light your soul's candle. And if you are absent minded and ignore Christ and think of other things during communion then the flame Jesus lights in your soul is weak and may go out. So it's important for you to prepare and think of Him during Communion so as to come closer to Him

The Eucharist and reconciliation are the keys to a good happy life. They do good work. You don't feel much emotion when you go to communion but you do see results in that they bring peace and strength to your spirit and bring you closer to Jesus.
