3:30pm to 5:30pm – Packaging/Barrel Washers – Prepare potatoes, package chicken and sausage, clean empty barrels.

5:30pm to 6:30pm – Sales at 5:00pm Mass (need at least 3 Knights at each table).

9:00pm to Midnight – Fire Starters – Build fire & put coals in pit.

Sunday 2/7/16

12:00 am to 3:00am – Cooks/Firemen – help put chickens on pit and turn them, replenish coals when needed. 3:00am to 6:00am – Cooks/Firemen – help put chickens on pit and tun them, replinish coals when needed.

6:00am to 9:00am - Cooks/Firemen – help put chickens on pit and tun them, replinish coals when needed, Clean up pit.

8:30am to 9:30am – Sales at 8:00am Mass (need at least 3 Knights at each table).

10:30am to 11:30am – Sales at 10:00am Mass (need at least 3 Knights at each table).

12:30pm to 1:30pm – Sales at 12:00pm Mass (need at least 3 Knights at each table). Clean up Sales area.

He was presented a \$2,500 check from the Council for the Guadalupe Home, money obtained from our Council's Skeet Shoot tournament fundraising.

At the meeting, Todd cited the Catholic Charities appreciation for receipt of our Council's donation for the Guadalupe Home. Much gratitude goes to the central figures of the fundraising event, Art Ramirez and Richard Lee.

The Guadalupe Home is a transitional living program for homeless expectant mothers and homeless mothers with infants. During their stay, mothers have a safe place to live and to prepare for birth, as well as have a home-like environment in which to nurture their baby. Women who come to Guadalupe Home are ready to improve their lives and the lives of their children.

It is noteworthy that St Marks Knights were personally involved many years ago in making the original facilities habitable, i.e., painting, carpentry, and installing fire escape (borrowed from St Marks old Knights two story building). The Knights involved in this work were Lloyd Anders, PGK Elroy Tschirhart, PGK John Thabet, PGK Nieves Gonzalez, PGK Sam Szalwinski, Troy Tollette, SN Fernando Arellano, and others.

The Civic Award is presented annually as a tribute to the spirit of patriotism and national pride exemplified in the patriotic activities conducted by Fourth Degree assemblies. Assemblies conducting a minimum of four different patriotic programs during the fraternal year are eligible for the Supreme Council Civic Award.

To be eligible, assemblies must complete and submit the Civic Award application to the Supreme Council office by June 30. All assemblies are encouraged to achieve Civic Award status each and every fraternal year.

Criteria for the Provincial Award for Excellence is set forth as follows:

- Meet the membership growth quota of 10%
- Complete all Assembly forms on time
- Achieve the Civic Award

These awards are mainly presented for our work with the Audie Murphey VA Hospital; the Center for the Intrepid; the Wounded Warrior Program; the SAMC Hospital Chaplaincy; and the Wheelchair Program.
