Membership Recruitment

FOURTH DEGREE EXEMPLIFICATION

There will be an exemplification of the Fourth Degree held in Kansas City, Mo. on Saturday April 20, 2013 at the Airport Hilton. Cost is \$79 plus tax per night. Deadline is April 1, 2013.

Our Honoree this year will be Father Christian Malewski. He is the pastor at Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Harrisonville. He is also the Missouri State Chaplain for the Knights of Columbus.

The schedule for the day will be:

Registration of Candidates	9:00 a.m to 11:30 a.m.
Candidates in Place	11:30 a.m.
Exemplification	12:30 p.m.
Mass	4:00 p.m.
Banquet	7:00 p.m.

All applications must have the candidate member's number and date of First Degree, the Candidates name, the signatures of the Financial Secretary of his Council, Navigator and Comptroller of his Assembly. He must be a 3rd Degree Knight. The first two pages of the application, along with the full initiation fee, shall be sent to the District Master (by the Navigator), and must be received no later than April 1, 2013 to allow sufficient time for printing of the banquet program and arrangement of banquet seating. Checks should be made payable to Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree. Since signatures are often difficult or impossible to decipher, please enclose a type written or printed list of candidates and proposers with the application.

The initiation fee is \$70.00 for laymen and Deacons and \$37 for Clergy. This fee will cover the social baldric, a lapel pin, 4th Degree certificate, and one banquet ticket. A suspender baldric will be available at a cost of an extra \$10.00. The cost of additional banquet tickets for wives, friends or other members is \$32.00 each. Enclosed is a banquet reservation Form to be used by all members and candidates to order additional banquet tickets. Please copy this form as needed.

Forward all completed banquet forms to **Charles Bernskoetter**, **PSD**, **Secretary to the Master**, **no later than April 1, 2013**. The official attire for candidates is black tuxedo, black bow tie, white formal shirt and black shoes. It will be the candidate's responsibility to make prior arrangements for the purchase or rental of his attire.

Because the Honor Guard Regalia includes a tuxedo and many social events that your assembly will sponsor may also require a tuxedo, you may wish to consider purchasing a tuxedo for this purpose. We ask that as many Honor Guard members as possible dress out for the Degree, the Mass, and the Banquet. Much help will be needed.

Tuxedo Rental

Anderson's will offer a Tuxedo Rental package including coat, trouser, pleated lay down collar shirt with black studs and links, black bow tie, cummerbund, black suspenders, formal shoes and socks for \$65.36 with tax. If the candidates wish to purchase a used Tuxedo, the above package will be available to them for \$163.40 with tax. With the Exemplification being April 20, 23 should probably give candidates a deadline date of April 13, so We aren't rushing around at the last minute trying to run down measurements, etc. I prefer that Tuxedos are paid for in full when we take the order so we aren't dealing with the money at the hotel Saturday morning.

For Councils in the immediate KC area, if they have at least 6 guys needing Tuxedos, we also make appointments, and the candidates are welcome to come to my office for measurements. Be sure to make an appointment, so we can be sure to have someone here.

In the past, we tried to deliver all of the Tuxedos that were purchased prior to the exemplification, so these candidates could come dressed if desired. The **rental** tuxedos will be brought to the hotel to a salon designated by the Knights' 4th Degree staff, where the candidates are assisted with getting dressed in a timely fashion. Once the event starts we lock up the salon room and reopen around 9:30 PM until 12 midnight to give rental customers an opportunity to return that evening. We then reopen Sunday morning at about 7:30 AM until 10:30 AM for the balance of the rental returns.

For the candidates located out of town, they can go to a Tuxedo store or Menswear store for measurements. Then they can forward a measurement card to us along with a check to Anderson's Formal Wear, 1401 Fairfax Trafficway Suite 221, Kansas City, 66115. The candidates can call us at 913-321-8920 and ask for Dennis or Bobbie with questions. Please be sure all information on the card is filled out completely, especially phone number, so if we have a question, we can contact the candidates.

Thanks to Wendell Vice, we now have found a local company, R&R Buttons, that will provide our KofC "dress shirts". While the prices are only a couple of \$s less per shirt, we can get all sizes, many more color selections, we do not have to pay any shipping charges, and we keep our money in the community.

These polo shirts are a 35/65% blend of cotton and polyester. They come with our embroidered KofC emblem, Council Name, number and your first name. Wendell is wearing Royal Blue. While there are many colors to choose from, the larger sizes (above XL are the ones with 4 dots). To date we have members with, White, Royal Blue, Navy Blue, and Kelly Green.

"TAX TIME AGAIN"

This month, I chose to pass up the opportunity to use the age old cliché about two things we must do.... although the timing should certainly bring it to mind.
