St. Valentine's Day February 14th



Is celebrated world wide as the day for sentimental love, although this idea is of much more recent origin than the several early

St. Valentine and his disciples supervising the construction of the basilica in Terni, Italy.

Christian martyrs who were each named Valentine.

The two saints most commonly associated with this day are: St. Valentine of Rome and St. Valentine of Terni. Both St. Valentines are buried on the Via Flaminia in Rome, in different locations. It wasn't until the 14th century that St. Valentine became associated with romance. By that time the distinctions

between the two martyrs was lost so we can say that this day is for both of them.

According to the story, St. Valentine was persecuted and imprisoned by the Emperor Claudius II, because he was a Christian. In the Emperor's interview with (St.) Valentine, Claudius was impressed by Valentine and tried to have him convert to Roman paganism in order to save his life. To the contrary, St. Valentine tried to convert the emperor to Christianity and this resulted in his execution! While in prison St. Valentine performed a miracle by healing the jailer's daughter who was blind. The night before his demise, St. Valentine is said to have written the first "valentine note" when he wrote to the blind daughter whom he had healed and signed this note as "From your Valentine".
