Grand Knight's Letter

My Brother Knights,

Deputy Grand Knight's Letter

Greetings Brothers,

I hope your winter is going well (I for one, am enjoying the mild weather). I would like to thank our fellow Knights who assisted with our council's first blood drive of the calendar year, organized again by Brother Mike D'Aiuto. It was held in conjunction with the American Red Cross on January 8 and 23 people were able to provide this gift of life.

The Sweetheart Valentine Dinner will be held on February 11 at Logan's Roadhouse on Fair Lakes Parkway in Fairfax at 7:00PM. Brother Joe Beres is the point of contact for RSVP (beresjg@verizon.net). I hope to see many of you there.

Our District Deputy (Rosario Chechile) brought to my attention a fundraiser opportunity that I would like share with the council. St. John Bosco Council (with the assistance of the St. Claire Council) has provided parking coordination for rowing regattas in Fairfax Station. John Bosco Council has informed the Fairfax County Park Authority that they will no longer be involved this coming spring. This is a tremendous fund-raising effort (\$9,000-\$15,000 per year), but is manpower dependent. There are

10-12 events in the spring and 4-5 events in the fall, with at least one really big event in each. The spring events usually happen every weekend starting in late March, sometimes on both Saturday and Sunday. There are high school and college events. The biggest events usually take about 20 parking volunteers. The average per day is about 10-14 people. The earliest shift is usually 6:00am-10:00am. While most events are completed by 2:00PM, occasionally they can go as late as 4:00PM. There may be a possibility of dividing the duties amongst the five councils in the district, but it will depend on how many volunteers are available. Another issue I would like to bring to your attention is the Building Fund Committee. We met on January 12 to discuss possible options for our Building Fund. Three motions to our Standing Resolutions have been drafted: (1) modify the fund; (2) dissolve the fund and distribute the money as the council sees fit; (3) leave the fund as is, with regular, annual dues being applied towards it. Details of the draft motions follow this letter for your review. We will be discussing these motions at the February 7 business meeting for updating as needed. A final council vote will be scheduled for the second business meeting in March. Your feedback on this important endeavor is solicited and welcomed.

Finally, I would like to remind everyone of our semi-annual cleanup of Compton Road and Bikes for the World. The cleanup will take place on April 14 from 8:00-11:00am from the church parking lot and Bikes for the World will take place after all masses on April 15. Brother Ed Rollins (rollinsem@cox.net) is chairing both events. Please consider assisting as you are able. Thank you.

Proposed Standing Resolutions

Proposed Standing Resolution Motion A.

That the Knights of Columbus Council #10947 Building Fund originally established through the Bylaws process, continue to be retained but under the provisions of this Standing Resolution. The following conditions apply to the operation of this fund itself and authorized uses for its proceeds:

No permanent fixed financial contributions to the fund are established or required. Financial contribution requirements, if any, are to be established each year as a part of the normal Council annual budget formulation process.

The Council #10947 Building Fund is authorized to be used to provide funding for facilities for Council. These may be rented, leased (1 year or more) or purchased Council facilities for either exclusive Council #10947 use or shared use with other Knights of Columbus or St. Andrew the Apostle Church organizations.

The Council #10947 Building Fund is also authorized to be used for Council equipment (administrative, food preparation and storage, furniture, storage facilities, etc.) and semi-durable goods (Ceremonial articles, ceremonial robes, food preparation utensils, etc.). This would not include single use, consumables, or disposable items.

Funds from the Council #10947 Building Fund are authorized for use for facility additions, renovations, repairs, major maintenance, and semi durable improvements to Council facilities and equipment or to Parish facilities and equipment where the Council regularly shares in their use.

Authorized expenditures amounts, submission of vouchers, and membership notification requirements established for the control of Council#10947 general funds will also apply equally to the Council #10947 Building Fund.

Monies within the Council #10947 Building Fund may only be invested in the following: CD's, other financial instruments, and accounts issued by banks with FDIC insurance backing, in United States Government issued Notes and Bonds, in financial instruments issued by the Knights of Columbus, and in investment grade quality Municipal Bonds issued by the Commonwealth of Virginia and its municipalities.

Build a designated room or addition when construction is planned to expand the church. This room or addition would have closets for council property and the council could use the wall space to display awards and pictures. (The risk of this option is the priest [or his replacement] could change the designation of this room or addition at any time.)

Proposed Standing Resolution Motion B.

That the Council #10947 Building Fund be dissolved. All funds associated with the former Council #10947 Building Fund are to be incorporated and become a part of the normal Council #10947 funds. The rules and

restrictions that apply to normal Council #10947 budgeting, authorized uses, expenditures, and investment options regarding its funds would apply to the funds transferred from the former Building Fund.

Proposed Standing Resolution Motion C.

Leave the Council #10947 Building Fund as is, with regular, annual dues being applied towards it.
