Grand Knights Letter

Brothers.

January was a very interesting month with the crazy weather forcing the cancellation of our First Degree and providing frigid temperatures for the March For Life. Despite the bad weather our newest Knight, Mike Michlowski made his first degree on January 25th. Congratulations Mike!

February is the month of the Passion of our Lord. It is a time to reflect on our Lord's ministry, the recruiting of the apostles and the conversion of the Jews. It was a miraculous and challenging time as our Lord changed the hearts and minds of a nation and eventually the world.

Bishop Loverde, in his Pastoral Letter on the "New Evangelization", says, "I have never been more convinced that each of us needs and desires a relationship with Jesus Christ in His Church." He goes on to say "When I was ordained ... 2 in 10 marriages ended in divorce. Abortion was illegal. Fewer than 300,000 Americans were incarcerated. Today, 2 in 10 pregnancies end in abortion, over 1 million annually, which is so heartrending. More than 4 in 10 marriages end in divorce, and in the public culture marriage and the family are in the process of being redefined. One in 31 adult Americans is in prison or on probation. Amid such brokenness, Pope Francis' analogy of the Church as a "field hospital" has never seemed Now is the time to find "a more fitting.

language of mercy," which he describes as "expressed in gestures and attitudes even before A nearly frantic search for peace, words". meaning, and hope is evident all around us. My foremost prayer is for the dawning of a New Evangelization here in the Diocese of Arlington. Simply put, it is a prayer that we might fall more deeply in love with Jesus Christ and share that love with another."

The letter First ("Me, an Evangelist?") has six parts. invites you to consider the most common personal blocks we experience to evangelization. Sixth you will be invited to consider how Mary, Star of the New Evangelization, can increase our faith and focus our mission as an evangelist. So stay tuned to learn more on this inspiring opportunity.
