# **PRO-LIFE NEWS**

Forty-three years ago the Supreme Court infamously decided the Roe v. Wade Case allowing abortion throughout this country. Since then over 55 million innocent pre-born babies have been murdered as a result of this decision. We Catholics believe in the sanctity of human life from the moment of conception until natural death and as brother Knights we practice this belief in our daily lives.

Last month, Father Rosensteel Council Knights of Columbus had two pro-life events to support the sanctity of life.

On Sunday evening, January 17, the Knights held its annual Pro-Life Kick-Off Rally featuring His Excellency Bishop Knestout, four pro-life speakers, Worthy State Deputy Stephen M. Cohen and his lovely wife Vicky, priests, religious, Council officers, the Cardinal O'Boyle Assembly Color Corps and other distinguished guests. There were approximately 140 attendees who enjoyed a free spaghetti and meatball dinner and wonderful pro-life talks addressing issues such as crisis pregnancy, sanctity of traditional marriage, euthanasia and the youth rally at the upcoming March for Life.

Many thanks to all those who made this event a success, from the Bishop, speakers, state and council officers, musicians, set-up crew, cooks, Squires, Roses, servers, photographer, bartenders and others.

The second event was the hosting of a high school group from Atlanta that arrived in Silver Spring for the annual March for Life. Twenty-five high school students and five chaperones, including a Catholic priest, spent three days and two nights at the Council. PGK Dan Ward and I stayed at the Council with the group, cooked meals and enjoyed their youthful enthusiasm and pro-life dedication.

On Friday they attended the rally and returned to the Council as their flights had been cancelled and had no other place to go. They eventually found lodging elsewhere where they could have hot showers and a soft bed.

# Baker Bill's Buttermilk Biscuits

2 cups all-purpose flour

1 tablespoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon Kosher salt

6 tablespoons unsalted butter, quartered and diced

1 cup buttermilk

Pre-heat oven to 450  $^{\circ}$ 

Use pastry cutter to mix dry ingredients and butter, add milk

Form dough ball and place on flowered surface.

By hand (not a rolling pin), knead and spread dough folding 4x.

Using 2 1/2 "biscuit or cookie cutter, cut out biscuits and place on non-greased baking sheet. If done right you'll get 10 biscuits. Bake for 15 minutes. Serve hot!

For the office of Outside Guard: Phil Azert (nominated from floor at January business meeting)


