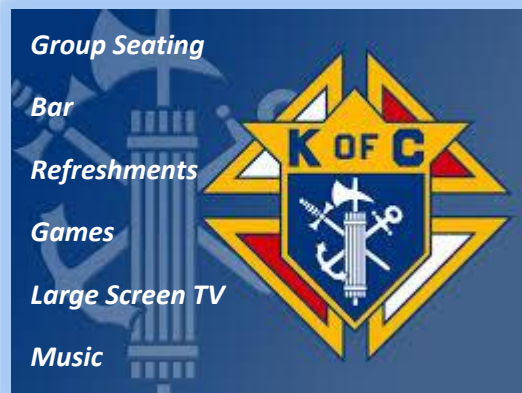

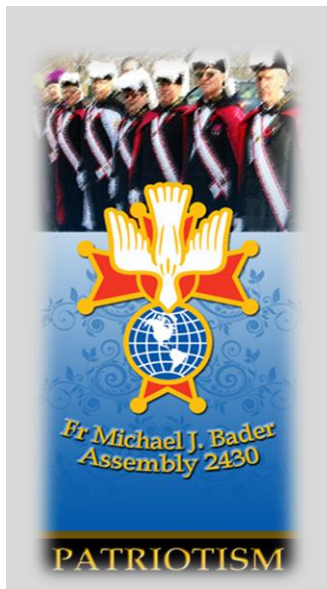

- The Declaration of Independence was a necessary and vital statement made at a time when the success of the American Revolution was doubtful and government by ordinary people was considered a new experiment, at best.
- The Declaration of Independence was the product of a democratic process that was the broadest expression of rights and liberties in the world at that time.
- The Declaration of Independence placed everything the Patriots held dear (their lives, their fortunes and their honor) in danger of sheer destruction.
- The Declaration of Independence is a relevant document important to the survival of our country today.
- It helps define us a land of the free.

February is also Black History month. We reflect on the contributions African-Americans have made in shaping our nation, culture and especially our civil rights policies. We remember the women and men who spent their personal and professional lives working to make things better, not only for themselves, but also for their families, their communities and our nation; not just for their generation, but also for the millions who came after them.
