"My Brother Knights, welcome to the new Fraternal Year. Buckle up, because it's going to be a wild ride.

"Last year the Knights of Columbus rolled out two new initiatives in particular which can and must be game changers for our Order here in Vermont. "A Charity that Evangelizes" was the first and is meant to bring K of C Councils into a tighter bond with the parishes they serve. It is based on five principles.

- 1. The Knights of Columbus is an organization dedicated to serving the Church through support of pastors and their parishes.
- 2. The members of a K of C council are a group of men who will become the pastor's "go-to guys" for the parish's needs.
- 3. A K of C council is not a ministry that calls upon the pastor's time or attention, rather it is a group of dedicated laymen that he can depend on.
- 4. A council is a venue for men in the parish to become better Catholics through service to their Church and community, and involvement in many of the other initiatives the K of C offers.
- 5. A K of C council in a parish is the gateway to an international organization of more than 1.8 million members."

With those words I began my State Deputy's Message back in July. And



apparently a lot of you took these words to heart. Because what I have seen at every turn since then is councils finding ways to become involved – or more involved – in their parishes and communities. I have seen councils whose pastors and chaplains had for some time remained at arm's length from the councils and their leadership, but who were now asking them for their help, thanking them for their help, attending their meetings and supporting their efforts.

And where this new involvement of our councils in their parishes bears the most abundant fruit is in the growth, real substantial growth, of our membership. Now, unfortunately our numbers are still trending downwards, but that trend has been slowed to a crawl over the last year. From January 1, 2016 to January 1, 2017 our total state membership only fell from 3,899 to 3,886 despite deaths and more than a few suspensions and withdrawals. How did we do it? By bringing in, or bringing back in, 67 members during the six months from July through December alone. And during the first seven months of the fraternal year we have brought in 72 members – as compared to 89 members for all of last year.

We didn't do it by hiding in our council halls. No, we did not! We attracted those members by being visible, remarkably visible, in our parishes. We were able not only to attract first time members, but also to make more than a few who had fallen away over the years take a second look, and look favorably on what they were seeing. In the past many joined the Knights of Columbus to serve their parishes and communities only to find that that was not what their councils were set up to do. And so they became discouraged and drifted away. But now those same former Knights surrounded by new, enthusiastic members who are forming the elemental, driving core of their councils are vigorous, enthusiastic, and – above all – effective in transforming the lives of their fellow parishioners, families, and even themselves.

Through programs such as the "Family Fully Alive, the Consecration to the Holy Family, Father's Day Affirmation of Wedding Vows – whether that is held on Father's Day or not, the 5th Sunday Rosary Program, Journey to the Inn; and Food for Families we are putting ourselves at the center of parish life by inspiring others to rediscover their Catholic faith and encouraging and helping them to live it out.

As I said, five members were received into the Order in January, all of them on the 9th or 10th and all into councils that have already recruited one or more members this year already. Soooo... no councils removed themselves from the "Haven't-Helped-Ourselves-Or-The-State-Council-By-Recruiting" board last month. The list of councils which have recruited remains the same.

District 1 – St. Albans 279 and Milton 10417

District 2 – St. Johnsbury 421 and Newport 2285

District 3 – Burlington 279, Winooski 2284, and So. Burlington 7525 (100% of Active District 3 Councils)

District 4 – Richmond 4684 and Colchester 7389

District 5 – Barre 399, Waterbury 2085, and Troy (100% of Active District 5 Councils)

District 6 – Norwich 9146, Bethel 10241, and Randolph 14351

District 7 – Middlebury 642

District 8 – Bellows Falls 753 and Brattleboro 917

District 9 – Rutland 232, Bennington 307, and Fair Haven 810

Councils, and especially their leadership have done a great job this year keeping up to date with their forms and now that the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity is due (January 31st) and the Semi-Annual Audits will be due soon (February 15) I am happy to say that from what I have seen, the trend of getting these forms in is continuing. This is a good sign and should be a point of pride for the councils and council officers who accomplish this.

Now is the time to take stock of what you have accomplished this year. The call has gone out for Anchor Award nominations, for Family and Knight of the Year nominations, for Longest Serving Knight nominations and for proposed Resolutions. Grand Knights should have received instructions for registering delegates for the State Convention. The call has gone out to submit your programs for awards. The State Board is busy as well

preparing for the State Convention. Letters of appointment will be going out soon asking our Brother Knights to serve on committees or perform needed tasks. Please answer with a willing heart. We need you.

We also need councils to step forward to host the 2018 Bowling and Golf Tournaments. No council volunteered to host either of the 2017 Bowling or 2017 Golf Tournaments and, as of this moment, it appears that these will not happen. I fear that two such years will mean the end of these traditions.

Finally: We need you.

I will not be a candidate for office on the State Board this year and, for personal reasons, State Treasurer Steve Shover, who has served the Board faithfully and well, will not be seeking to remain on the Board in any capacity. Now, the fact is that all five seats on the Board are up for grabs every year. That's the plain and simple truth. And any Third Degree Knight in good standing can run for any office (except that a State Deputy can serve no more than four years). Three sitting Board members have chosen to remain on the Board if the members will have them, but we need to fill a total of five seats. If you wish to serve your State Council in an exceptional and honorable way this may be for you. Please give it some thought and discuss this with one of the State Officers or a past state officer.

We are also in need of a chairman for our State Audit Committee. Our most recent chairman, Larry Barrows did an outstanding job but also has run up against personal issues which will not allow him to remain in that office. If you have an accounting background and wish to serve your State Council in a position which takes only a very small amount of your time this may be for you. Call me.




FREE THROW COMPETITION 2017

Jurisdiction of Vermont State Membership Incentives

Vermont's Top Recruiter (July 1, 2016 – March 31, 2017) will receive a trip for himself and his spouse to the 2017 Vermont State Convention at the Capital Plaza Hotel and Conference Center in Montpelier, Vermont in addition to any other membership incentive. (He must have recruited a minimum of 5 new members. The tie for this or any other membership incentive will go to the recruiter whose most recent recruit received his Admission Degree first.)

Each Top District Recruiter (July 1, 2016 – March 31, 2017) will receive a set of enameled cufflinks (his choice of Emblem of the Order or Fourth Degree. He must have recruited a minimum of 4 new members).

The First 5 Recruiters to Recruit 3 New Members (July 1, 2016 – May 31, 2017) will receive a gift card valued at \$50. The gift card will be upgraded to \$80 if the 3 New Member goal is reached by October 31, 2016.

Each Recruiter Recruiting at least 3 New Members – other than the First Five – (July 1, 2016 – May 31, 2017) will receive a gift card valued at \$30. The gift card will be upgraded to \$60 if the new member goal is reached by October 31, 2016.

Each Recruiter With At Least One Recruit (Admission Degree Date post July 1, 2016)

Who Earns the Shining Armor Award by May 31, 2017 will receive a Howard Miller mantle clock valued at \$55.

Each Recruiter (July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017) will receive a Vermont Development Drive 365 coffee mug. (Limit one per year.)

Councils Which Meet Their Membership Quota by December 31, 2016 will receive a 50% discount on their 2nd Half State Per Capita bill as long as all other State Council assessments have been paid. They will receive a 65% discount on the same assessment if they reach their Membership Quota by November 15, 2016.

District Deputies Who Have 2 Councils Which Meet Their Membership Quota by April 10, 2017 will receive a Knights of Columbus Gents' Two-tone Sports Watch. "Recruited" means that the recruit has received his Admission Degree.
