## Chaplain's Reflection The Prosperity Gospel

As people of faith, we know that God loves each of us unconditionally. We know that God wants the best for all of us because He wants us to be happy in this life, not just in eternal life. Yet we can see that not all of us live in the best of circumstances in this world. This is the condition of the world. This is why Jesus taught us that to love your neighbor (who you do see) is equal in importance to loving God (who you do not see) (cf. Mt 22:37-39).

Why some of us live in better circumstances than others is a mystery. The prosperity gospel attempts to explain this by proposing that God answers our prayers based on our faithfulness. However, this is not very comforting when bad things happen to good people. The prosperity gospel simply does not make sense given that Jesus has told us that His Heavenly Father makes the sun rise on the bad and the good, and the rain fall on the just and the unjust (cf Mt. 5:45).

Even so, if God really rewarded his best followers with a life of wealth and good health, what about Jesus himself who endured one of the most painful executions in human history, or any of the saints, some of whom were beggars and lepers? No matter how nonsensical it is, the irrational belief that God rewards us for our faithfulness still has a way of influencing our understanding of God. While we might not be willing to say that everyone who endures sickness, poverty or unhappiness in their life is suffering because of a lack of faith, we might be willing believe that God has rewarded us with good health, material comfort and happiness because we have put our trust in Him, at least some of the time.

The lie of the prosperity gospel goes even deeper than just claiming that God's justice is neat and tidy, and everyone gets what they deserve on this earth. At its heart is a refusal to accept the mystery that God's ways are not our ways. A refusal that is fueled by the human pride that accompanies the blithe assumption that God is a predictable being, who reacts to us in a way that we can always understand.

Throughout C.S. Lewis' *Chronicles of Narnia*, his characters are constantly reminded that Aslan, a Christ figure, is "not a tame lion" because we can never know the mind of God. We do know that God is love, light and truth; that God is a merciful Father and that God

will not abandon us. But we are not told much about the specifics of what God chooses. Without acknowledging that God's ways are inscrutable, we can start to get pretty critical of them when we see the awful things that can happen to his children on a daily basis. Things that we would never allow to happen if we were God.

But assuming that we can understand God's actions and motives feeds directly into another prosperity gospel mistake that God steps directly into even the most ordinary events of our lives. A young woman once gushed that God had done her a real favor that day by turning all the traffic lights in her path green. Maybe God did. But acting like we understand his specific actions, what he did and why, puts us in a bad place. It means that either God has human limitations or that our human understanding is equal to that of God.

We need to let God be God. God has revealed a lot about himself, but we have so much more to learn. There is a lifetime's worth of richness in the simple fact that God loves us and that he is present, without trying to figure out the what and the why of his actions.

Groundhog Day or Candlemas? On February 2, a quaint tradition unfolds, known well to schoolchildren and adults alike. The fate of spring hangs in the balance as a burrowing animal looks for its shadow. But where did this tradition come from?

For centuries, February 2 has been celebrated as Candlemas, a Christian Feast Day. Candlemas is also called the Feast of the Presentation because it honors the day that Mary and Joseph presented the infant Jesus at the Temple. In bringing their child to the temple and offering a sacrifice, Jesus' parents were following the Mosaic Law.

The date of Candlemas is always February 2 because it is exactly 40 days (inclusive) after Christmas. The Mosaic Law stated that 40 days was the period of purification after the birth of a child and so the presentation took place 40 days after Jesus was born. Incidentally, February 2 is also halfway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox, so the date has always had significance for ancient people.

So what's the connection to Groundhog Day? Candlemas became linked to weather predictions about the end of winter because of an old English poem: If Candlemas be fair and bright, come winter, have another flight. If *Candlemas bring clouds and rain, go winter, and come* not again.

It makes sense that early February was a good time to prognosticate about the weather, especially as February 2 marks the midpoint between winter and spring. And the English poem appears to be the source of the shadow connection: "fair and bright" indicates sun, the groundhog sees his shadow and we'll have more winter. While "clouds and rain" indicates no sun, the groundhog does not see his shadow and we'll have an early spring.

We can discuss which groundhog saw what at our next luncheon on February 26.
