

## **Our Principles**

All the good works we do are informed by our four core principles:

Charity – Our Catholic faith teaches us to "Love thy neighbor as thyself." Members of the Knights of Columbus show love for their neighbors by conducting food drives and donating the food to local soup kitchens and food pantries, by volunteering at Special Olympics, and by supporting, both spiritually and materially, mothers who choose life for their babies. Knights recognize that our mission, and our faith in God, compels us to action. There is no better way to experience love and compassion than by helping those in need, a call we answer every day.

**Unity** – None of us is as good as all of us. Members of the Knights of Columbus all know that – together – we can accomplish far more than any of us could individually. So we stick together...we support one another. That doesn't mean that we always agree or that there is never a difference of opinion. It does mean that – as a Knight of Columbus – you can count on the support and encouragement of your brother Knights as you work to make life better in your parish and community.

**Fraternity** – The Venerable Michael J. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus, in large part, to provide assistance to the widows and children left behind when the family breadwinner died – often prematurely. The Order's top-rated insurance program continues to do this today, as do individual Knights, who last year gave more than 10 million hours of their time to assist sick and/or disabled members and their families. In the Knights of Columbus, we watch out for and take care of one another.

**Patriotism** – Members of the Knights of Columbus, be they Americans, Canadians, Mexicans, Cubans, Filipinos, Poles, or Dominicans, are patriotic citizens. We are proud of our devotion to God and country, and believe in standing up for both. Whether it's in public or private, the Knights remind the world that Catholics support their nations and are amongst the greatest citizens.

It all ended on January 31 with the Special Olympian Basketball Tournament. Thank you to all who made these events possible.

I now call your attention to the Valentine's Dinner Dance being held on Saturday, February 7 in the Parish Centre. I encourage members to plan to attend the evening and invite another couple or two; with your help, the event will be another success.

On February 12, we will be assisting Holy Family School in Oakville with their Pasta Dinner Fund Raiser. We will be doing the cooking for them. On February 17, we are cosponsoring the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper with the C.W.L. and the parish Young Vincentians.

In closing, I want to thank you for your co-operation in providing me with your Fraternal Activity Survey. In our short life as a Council, we have donated 5,095 volunteer hours and \$4,103 in Charitable Disbursements. If we put a modest value of \$10.00 per volunteer hour, our Council contributed over \$55,000 to our community. In addition, a modest value of the 12,000 pounds of dry goods we collected for the Good Shepherd Centre in December, we can add another \$12,000 to \$15,000 bringing our total contribution to \$70,000 or \$2,592 per member. CONGRATULATIONS BROTHERS!

## Special Olympics athletes now a part of free-throw competition

Twenty-five qualify for Knights of Columbus event set for next weekend


This year for the first time the Knights of Columbus has invited Burlington's Special Olympics athletes to participate in the city's annual Basketball Free Throw competition.

The K of C have sponsored the event in Burlington and across North America for more than 40 years to encourage up-and-coming athletes.

Yesterday, those Special Olympic athletes took part in a qualifying competition at the Haber Recreation Centre.

Qualifiers will advance to the annual competition, set for Corpus Christi High School, on Saturday, Jan. 17.

The Special Olympics athletes are coached by Ken Medland. Thursday, they showed amazing talent, with 25 athletes moving on to Saturday's competition.



Alexa Jooris led all of the competitors by sinking 11 of her 15 attempts, with Lee Nolan next with eight successful attempts from the free-throw line.

Volunteers helped Medland with tracking the progress of the participants.

Representatives from the Knights of Columbus were also on hand, providing a colour guard parade of athletes into the gym among other duties.


The local Knights stress this opportunity is an important part of the focus of the association.

Other recent K of C endeavours included a food drive in support of the Good Shepherd Food Bank at Longo's on Fairview Street in December and a Bottle Drive for the Ontario Special Olympics in the Aldershot community in October.

In addition to the free throw competition, the Knights of Columbus is sponsoring an event at the Burlington Performing Arts Centre — the Toronto All Star Big Band on Jan. 25, with tickets available at the box office — and the Dr. Frank Hayden Special Olympics Basketball Tournament scheduled for Jan. 31.

Fifty advance to district championships

Fifty sharpshooters advanced to the next round after the Knights of Columbus hosted its annual Basketball Free Throw competition at Corpus Christi secondary school on Saturday.

The event was hosted by the four K of C councils in Burlington, with a maximum of four qualifiers heading back to Corpus Christi on Saturday, Feb. 7 for the district championships.

Five schools had were awarded trophies for 100 per cent participation in the council competition — Charles R. Beaudoin, St. Mark, St. John, Bruce T. Lindley and Pauline Johnson. The school with the highest number of participants, Beaudoin with 484, earned a second trophy.

Participants attempt to sink as many free throws as possible in 15 opportunities.

Over 200 local youth participated in the Burlington Basketball Free Throw event held at Corpus Christi high school, including 25 Special Olympic athletes. The Pope John Paul II 4<sup>th</sup> degree colour guard lead the athletes into the gym. Four Burlington councils participated in the event so the top 4 athletes in each age group were able to advance to the district final on February 7, 2015. The regional final will take place on February 28<sup>th</sup> in Waterloo.

### **BIG BAND CONCERT**

The Burlington Big Band concert sponsored by the Knights of Columbus was held at the Burlington Performing Arts Center on Sunday January 25th. Our own SK Vic Lefebvre was the chairman for the special event and it was a huge success. Almost 500 people turned out to see the Toronto All-Star Big Band perform many hits from the 30's, 40's and 50's. Vic introduced the band and did a super job of promoting the Knights of Columbus and also honouring local war veterans who were in attendance.

The four local councils and the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Assembly joined together to promote this event and they took the opportunity to set up a display table in the lobby. All of the K of C banners were displayed along with the Canadian and K of C flags. Several signs, brochures and other media were used to invite new members to join the Knights. The event returned a good profit and those funds will be shared by the four Councils and the Assembly and put to good use supporting various charitable activities.
