With Lent almost here, this is a good time for us to think about what Lent means to us as a member of the Knights of Columbus. Every year we are in a different place in our faith. Hopefully further along in holiness this year than last.


The staples of Lent are Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. We could ask ourselves, how are we going to spiritually move further in these areas this Lent? It is good to set goals at the beginning of Lent in each of these areas to hold us accountable during these six weeks. Lent is not always about giving something up, but giving more of ourselves to grow closer to God.

The goals we set should be manageable. Perhaps the goals could be as simple as praying a little more, coming to daily Mass if possible, going to Friday Stations of the Cross, reading a spiritual book, coming to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with Benediction on Thursday evenings, or stopping in on Monday for Adoration during the day or going to the parish Sanctus Retreat on March 4th.

There are many ways of fasting that does not involve food, like fasting from criticism or negativity, gossip or fasting from a bad habit.

Almsgiving could be giving more generously of our time and talent in our parish or helping others.

Lent is a time for we Knights to strive for holiness. Let us use the three staples of Lent this year as our guide, to not only prepare ourselves for Easter, but in helping



others and ourselves to feel God's love and presence more fully through our Lenten sacrifices.

May you all have a Blessed and Happy Lent.

Supreme created the Building the **Domestic Church** programs to encourage councils down this path.

Close ties to the parish and school have not been a problem for our council but most of our activity is centered

around cooking, Fish Frys, Frys, Breakfast Sundays and smoking hams are the the staples of our activity. activity. With the help of some very dedicated people, these activities almost seem to happen on on their own volition. Those organizing these events are not even sure how many Knights will show up, but they also do do not worry because you you always show up. Cooking will always be a council activity, and the parish would have it no other way, but we are not all cooks.

Your officers have discussed for several months how we might expand into other areas and more fully support our parish. Some of the suggestions have highlighted areas that we individually already do but have not embraced as a group, i.e. Hospitality Ministry. Others have looked into our spiritual development which are key components of the **Building the Domestic** Church programs. These changes will provide opportunities for personal growth and council diversity and the more visible aspects can serve as a reminder to the parish of the council's commitment and support.
