As reported by the Catholic News Agency, Jan 31, 2020, "The Knights of Columbus has announced a major revision to its longtime initiation ceremonies and for the first time will open them to the public..."

"The new ceremony will now combine all three degrees and, in another major change, will be opened to the public. Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said the exemplification may be conducted in a council's meeting chamber or in a church, "with families and friends seated in the pews." "They will see firsthand the organization that their husbands, fathers, brothers, sons and friends are joining — the principles and values they are committing to and why it matters."
