represent sorrow or grief for our personal sins and as a symbol of our repentance.

Lent will last for 46 days from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. This marks the time Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness and is our time of commemorating the resurrection of Christ. We suffer through fasting and we celebrate his resurrection at the end of the period.

Many list things to give up during Lent to test their abstinence and to add a bit of suffering through their "giving up" offering. When I was going through RCIA, I elected to "take on" a new habit instead of giving up chocolate or something along those lines. I took up reciting the Rosary each day. That new habit has

served me well as a Brother Knight, though I still struggle with my memory on occasion. So, as promised during my 1st Degree, I carry my Rosary with me each day and recite it as often as I am able during the day. It has become a relaxing ritual for me and a time of reflection on the day to become and the day that has past – always rejoicing in another day, but accepting of God's Will to be done.

As Knights of Columbus, the number one reason most Knights joined the Order was to increase their spiritual growth amongst other like-minded Catholic gentlemen. We will always work to improve our spiritual nature and habits through our service and our sacrifices for our fellow man in our Church and Community. Let us also strengthen our bonds as Brothers in Christ with the leadership of our Chaplain and the Clergy of our Church and community.

Keep your Faith strong, for yourself, your family, your Church, your Community, and your Brother Knights.

Brother Knights,

I write to you today to share some wonderful news. On November 3, your Knights of Columbus surpassed \$100 Billion of life insurance in force, further cementing our position as one of the largest life insurers in North America.

It is a tremendous achievement, and one that we should all celebrate – let me tell you why.

We don't have enough to send the children to school. We don't have enough to make a terrible time easier.

That \$100 billion number makes me smile because I know that bringing that number up, means bringing the number of unprotected widows down. I know that sometime in the not too distant future, 100 will become 150, and 150 will become 200, and subsequently the number of brother Knights left uninsured at the time of their death will decrease, the number of widows and orphans provided for will increase, and Catholic families will flourish, despite the odds, because of the diligent planning of a brother Knight – just as Father McGivney would have wanted.

What a tremendous number. What a point of pride for you and for me.

For those of you that have given the Knights of Columbus the privilege of helping to protect your family's financial future: thank you for your trust.

For those of you that haven't yet: there has never been a better time to turn to your Knights of Columbus. We are here to protect you, just as Father McGivney intended us to be. That is a claim that no other company can ever make. We are the premier Catholic insurance company, and we are yours.


