



I am pleased to inform you that I recently received the Immaculate Conception Icons from the Supreme Council. The Maryland State Icon Program began the weekend of October 6th with Districts 3 and 4. On October 20<sup>th</sup>, Districts 9 and 21 received these Icons and the program will continue through the end of June 2014. Please note: Since the Icons did not arrive until late September, the following Districts scheduled for July, August and September are not on the current schedule: Districts 13, 17, 22, 23, 24, 26, and 33. However, a third Icon is available for these Districts on an as needed basis.

It is located on the left side of the State Council page and can be found by opening the Program Activities and Church programs tabs. Continuing a decades-long tradition, the Knights of Columbus launched their fifteenth international prayer program in August. The new program, centering on the Immaculate Conception, was announced by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson at the Organizational Meeting of State Deputies in New Haven, CT. Since the first prayer program began in 1979, more than 16 million faithful have participated in the Knights' sponsored holy hours. This year's program marks the second time the Order will hold a program consecrated to the Immaculate Conception. The first program was held from 1981-1982.

The Order commissioned nearly 100 icons of the Immaculate Conception using an image from Notre-Dame de Quebec, in Quebec City at the August-2013 international convention in San Antonio, TX. The icons will travel throughout the world, under the organization of local Knights' councils who will present prayer programs with the icon for their parishes and communities. The current program, dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe, concluded this past August. It has been the most successful prayer program in the Order's history, Anderson said.




#### ALTAR SERVERS RECOGNITION MASS




