

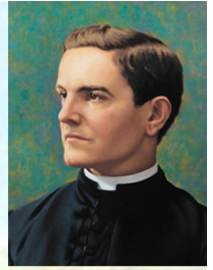

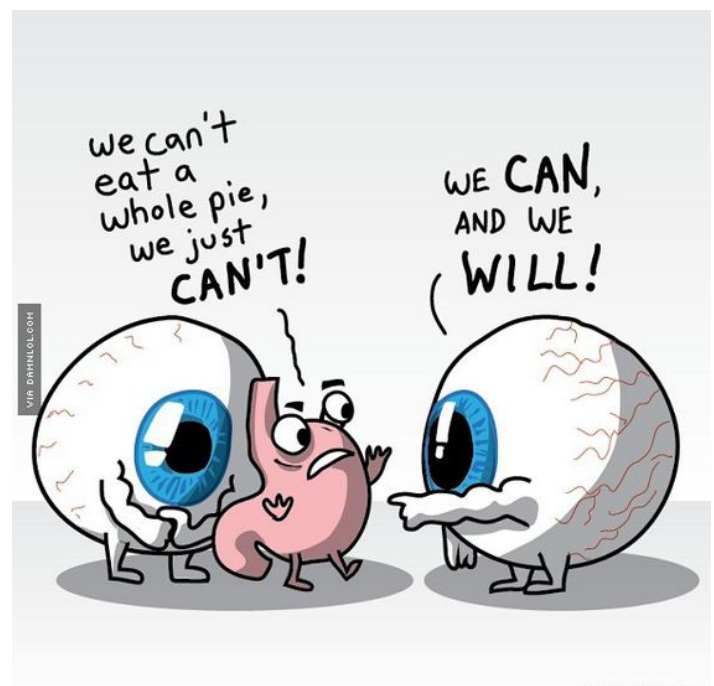
## SCHOLARSHIP

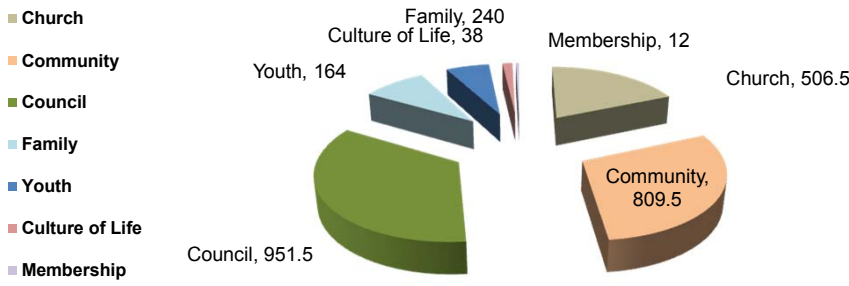

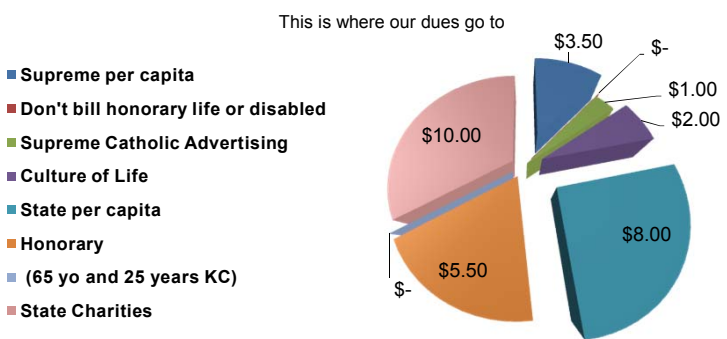

This is how 2721.5 hours break up as of: **March 2018**

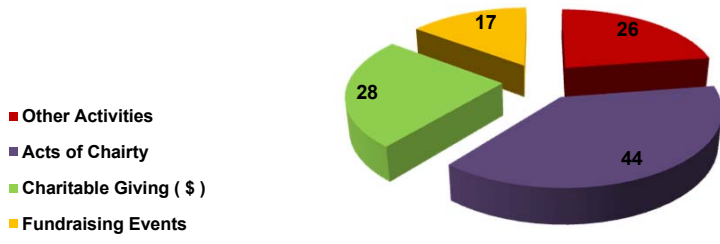
