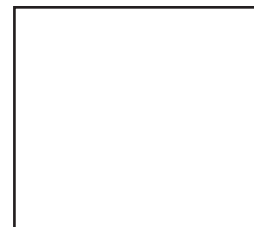

I will be glad to personally work with you in this effort as well as get you more information on the ACE Wings Program.

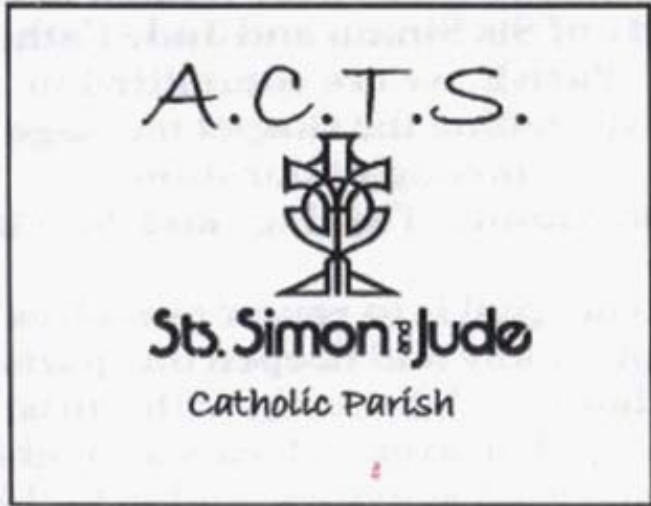

Outdoor Mass Concludes Pope's U.S. Trip

Philadelphia USA - Celebrating an open-air Mass before hundreds of thousands of people lined along the Benjamin Franklin Parkway in Philadelphia, Pope Francis ended his six-day visit to the United States with a message of joy and hope for family life.

Delivering his Sunday Mass homily in Spanish, which was translated on jumbo screens placed along the parkway, Pope Francis said that the family is the foundation for society and the Church.

"That is why our families, our homes, are true domestic churches. They are the right place for faith to become life, and life to become faith," he said.

Family life is built on daily acts of charity, sacrifice and "little gestures," he added.

"These little gestures are those we learn at home, in the family," the pope said. "They get lost amid all the other things we do, yet they do make each day different. They are the quiet things done by mothers and grandmothers, by fathers and grandfathers, by children. They are little signs of tenderness, affection and compassion."

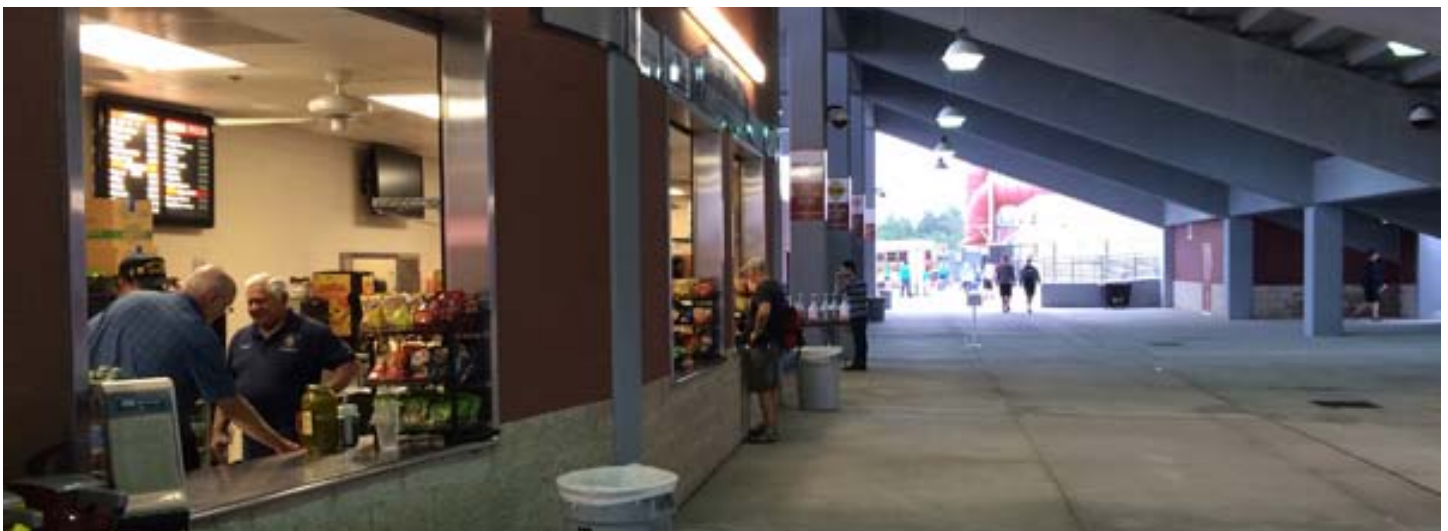
