During the last eight months this council has gone from being one of the many mediocre councils to being in the top five in membership growth in the state of Texas. This growth has been coupled with an unprecedented number of successful projects and activities.

In the last issue I asked the new members to step up to the challenge and many did just that. This included both at the KC level as well as in the parish environment. These new activities combined with our ongoing efforts headed up by our veteran members have contributed greatly to a more healthy and productive environment in our parish and council.

Our fraternal year started off with a major donation of \$5,000 to the Pregnancy Care Center and the coordination of the acquisition of an Ultrasound system. With a donation of more than \$23,000 from Supreme Headquarters, the new state of the art system will serve the entire Texoma area for years to come.

We had two highly successful major fundraisers in Sherman and Denison headed up by Br.

This was followed by a great Christmas Party enjoyed by everyone. Claire Freeman did a fantastic job coordinating the Angel Tree and alleviating this job from our church secretary. Br. Gary Cox chaired the Pro-Life Flag Project and with the help of many members (and some ladies) planted the 3,000 flags on a rainy day in January. Their removal was made easier with the assistance of Br. Ryan Buchanan and his LifeTeen group.

Br. Tom Garlock headed up our project to collect disposable razors and cans of shaving cream to be donated to the Salvation Army. He placed large cardboard containers at the entrances of the church and through the generosity of our parishioners we donated three large boxes of this material.

The Donut Ministry continued under the direction of a Knight. Br. Lyle Klement, a reinstated member from the Muenster Council took on the job and he and his family are doing a great job. Br Peter Ang and his wife, Peggy, continue to work in the distribution of bread to people in need.

We had a successful brisket sale during Super Bowl weekend but unfortunately underestimated the waste factor of uncooked brisket. However we raised approximately \$350 and donated \$200 to the Texoma Pregnancy Care Center.

Our efforts to start a Squires Circle have not been successful to date. We had a small turnout for our orientation session for potential members and their parents. We believe this small showing is partly due to the very successful LifeTeen and EDGE programs already in existence in our parish. We will continue to pursue this objective. We did donate \$500 to the LifeTeen program for their upcoming Summer Retreat. We will also put on a pancake breakfast in the near future with them to help them achieve their goal of \$2,800 to pay for the trip.

We had a highly successful Lenten canned food drive bringing in almost 2,200 cans of food. DGK Mike Riley headed up this effort with all the food distributed to three food pantries in the area.

We also continued to have success hall rentals which brought in the funds to pay our operating expenses.

We lost a key member of our council when Br. Richard Antonelli moved to Connecticut to be closer to his family. He left a big hole and it will be difficult to replace him.

We also lost Br. Ed DeFrange, SK Werner Frietsch M.D., and SK Fred Ramirez. Not only will we miss them, but their loss will be felt by the entire St. Patrick Community. God rest their souls.

The party was held in a facility donated by a brother Knight and many of the major prizes were donated by brother Knights as well. Council 830 donated \$2,500 to the party to underwrite some of the upfront expense. These were part of the funds raised at the Sherman Art Fest and Denison Main Street Festival. All proceeds from the Hoolie will be used to help pay for the restoration of St. Patrick church which is estimated to cost \$1.1 million.

Knights were also plentiful cooking and serving at the annual Lenten Fish Fry's. These projects are examples of the many activities supported by individual Knights.
