Field Agent Report April 2021

The Need for Mentorship

On March 19, 2021, the Diocese of Green Bay's Year of St. Joseph concluded with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist at the national Shrine of Saint Joseph in De Pere. As you know, we are currently in a year of Saint Joseph in the Universal Church, which was declared by Pope Francis. Since February, I have made a special consecration to Saint Joseph, first with my wife and boys, and then with the Nowak Agency. I find it comforting to know that every part of my life is now under the special protection and care of Saint Joseph, the Patron of the Catholic Church.

Saint John Paul II has been attributed for teaching throughout his priesthood that man cannot fully find himself, except through a sincere gift of himself. As Knights of Columbus, the notion of gift of self is often taken as a no brainer, since our values of charity, unity, and fraternity are expressions of this teaching. But to the mainstream culture in which we operate, those who model Saint Paul II's teaching and our values are like rays of light that shine in the darkness. Besides our Blessed Lord and Our Lady, can you think of a better model for making a sincere gift of self than Saint Joseph? If there ever was a time that needed the manly virtues of Saint Joseph more, Providence is making it clear to us that now is the time.

Years ago, I was introduced to a little book titled, *Growing Up Wild*. The basic premise of the book is to show that boys become men of virtue only through rites of passage, under the tutelage of other men who pass on the meaning and norms of authentic masculinity. Absent of the passing on of authentic masculinity, boys remain boys long into adulthood. The consequences to family life, the church, and culture are terminal to be sure. I believe the remedy to helping boys become men is through true devotion to Saint Joseph, and what we as Knights of Columbus have to offer.

Many young men today need other men to model what it means to be a man, husband, and father. After losing my own father at age 19, I had several brother Knights come to me at my dad's funeral to tell me not to lose touch with them nor the council. Sadly, I didn't listen. I spent the better part of the next two decades trying to find my way through young adulthood without a father and good examples of authentic masculinity. True to His promises, however, Jesus came looking for me, His lost sheep. He used the Knights of Columbus and a few stellar brother Knights to help accomplish His will for my life. Brothers, though I am far from perfect, I wouldn't be the husband and father I am today, if it wasn't for the Knights of Columbus and the men who call themselves Knights. I love the high ideals that we strive for as noble Knights of Columbus. I am challenged by them. They give me a sharper focus of what all of us should be striving for: holiness of life. But what man doesn't need a real challenge, to live holier lives as disciples of Jesus? This is where you, my brothers, come in.

Between now and the end of the fraternal year, I want to challenge every one of you to contemplate the attributes of Saint Joseph, a model of masculine virtue for our times. Then seek out two to three young men to be mentored by you and the other men of the Order to become the man God desires them to be: more faithful, more charitable, more noble. In sum, a Knight of Columbus.

On February 23, the Nowak Agency and Daniel Purtell from the Wilson Law Group provided hundreds of participants with much needed guidance on the principles of Estate Planning that is rooted in our Catholic values.
