# Knight/Family of the Month/Year

Worthy Sirs,

We all run programs every month that are Chaired by a member of the Council, or the family of a Council member. We have Chaplains in our Councils that go over and above when it comes to programs or events run by the Council.

These are the men and families that should be nominated for Knight of the Month, Family of the Month and Chaplain of the Month. This is one of the easiest programs for a Council to run each month. There are basically 2 ways to handle this: a) The Grand Knight chooses the person or family to be named as Knight or Family of the Month; or b) the Grand Knight forms a committee to choose the Council's winners.

The Knight of the Month Program is extremely valuable for the recognition of Council Members. The recognition of a Brother Knight for exceptional contributions to the Council, a man that exemplifies his Faith through his actions, can inspire others to greater efforts. The selection should be based upon the members activities during the month. For example, a member that ran your Council's Christmas Poster Contest could be named your Knight of the Month for December at the January meeting. The form for this program can be found in section 5.5 of the Grand Knights Manual.

The <u>Famly of the Month</u> could be a member of your Council, but does not necessarily need to be a member. It could be a family that has done something extraordinary for your Council, Parish or Community. The form for this program can be found in section 5.3 of the Grand Knights Manual. The family can also be nominated for the Supreme Council Family of the Month award. This form can be found on the Supreme Website.

At the State Convention each May, the State Council announces a Knight of the Year and a Family of the Year. These nominations are due to the State Chairman by March 31.

# PROGRAM CORNER PATRIOTIC CORNER

Hello Worthy Brothers,

We have now entered 2020 and in the second half of the fraternal year. Your Columbian Award reports should be at least half-full. Keep in mind there are three driving forces that you need to be doing to allow your Council to be successful in the **FAITH IN ACTION** program model.

First: **Contact and work with you pastor**. This is the foundation of the FIA program. While not all Pastors totally support all Councils there is no better way to bring them into the fold.

Second: Ensure you have a strong Program Director and utilize him as much as possible. Your Program Director will get you what you desire (The Columbian Award).

Finally, **Reporting of your Programs**. Currently, reporting of programs is very low with the State Council, and if we do not know what you are, struggling with we cannot help you. I cannot stress this enough. We are here to help you with your programs. Speaking of reporting all Councils should make sure their forms are completed and submitted. There are still Councils that have not completed their forms 185, 365, and 1295. Check your records and if you have not done them get them in. So very important for your Council. Also, remember that the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (Form 1728) is due by the end of the month (1/31). Remember all forms (State and Supreme) are on the State Website.

There are many programs yet to do and you can fill up on those that are required. **Consecration to the Holy Family** has just completed, but you do not need to conduct this program now, complete it any time before 7/1.

As we go into January, remember all the Special Olympic programs. **Polar Bear Plunge** and **Intellectual Disabilities Drives** are coming. While April may be Intellectual Disabilities month, you do not have to wait to begin; this is a year round program. Start your drives early and remember to send all collected monies to the State, IRS requirements mandate this.

January begins the **Free Throw Tournament**, as well as the **Spelling Bees** for Councils, with the Districts following in February. Regionals and State finals will be in March. You should already have your Free Throw Kits from Supreme, and your sites reserved and notifications out to the schools and local recreation centers for both activities.

#### LIFE IS FOR LIVING

As we start the new year, I am reminded that we all want to retire on our own terms. When we want to, how we want to and with confidence that our planning will allow us to have a comfortable retirement. I was reminded of these thoughts, because one of the best agents in New Jersey chose to retire at the end of 2019. Guy Mariani, who was a great agent for almost 17 years with the Order, decided that he wanted to play more golf, enjoy warmer weather and spend more time with his wife and grown children.

He and so many of our brothers, are looking at these simple questions:

What will I get from Social Security? Should I take it now, or wait? What will my real living expenses be, when I retire? Can I afford to stay in New Jersey, or do I have to relocate to a lower tax state? Will my nest egg last?

These questions need to be asked, before you make the decision to retire, and even better if you ask them a few years ahead of time.

Social security is not an entitlement, as so many in government want to brand it. We all have paid into it for decades and it is a promise to be kept. Social security is an annuity funded by our contributions that guarantees us a monthly payout in our "golden" years.

Unfortunately, 20-25% of all Americans retiring today have only Social Security to live on. Another \$30-35% will have less than \$100,000 of retirement savings on top of that. Half of today's retirees are dependent on Social Security for their survival in retirement. Social security was never intended to be the entire retirement plan for most Americans. It was intended to be a bridge to cover basics, or a safety net for the poor.

As we start the New Year, often we make resolutions. All of us need to resolve to seriously look at what we are doing for retirement. We need to look past the 40+ years of print, radio and TV advertising touting Rates of Return, (which are always given "gross" with no mention of fees etc.). The financial "entertainers" spout clichés, that no longer make sense, (and never did because they never truly factored in down years in the market). We need to see past those clichés to the real returns and not buy products based on advertising, but by what those products will really do for us in our retirement.
