Now is a good time to take stock of how we are progressing toward our goals at your district level, goals for district deputies and your council level, goals for grand knights.

Primary in reaching your goals is the review of plans made for membership growth for your councils. Are you on target to meet your council growth goal?

With the New Year comes new opportunities to promote the Culture of Life. Hopefully, members of your council are planning to take the trip to Washington for the March for Life on January 22. If you can't do that, then plan to attend the Rally for Life in Trenton organized by New Jersey right to life. Details can be found on their website through this <u>LINK</u>.

In addition, every 22nd of the month I hope you are asking your pastor to dedicate a Respect Life Mass, or have a prayer service at a council meeting, as part of our Prayers for Babies program. Details are in the Grand Knight's Handbook. Let us continue the fight to make abortion a thing of the past!

We also have a couple of programs coming up in February. First, on Ash Wednesday, February 18, we have our second Turn Off the TV day. Let's let the networks know how much we disapprove of their inappropriate programming by not only turning off our TVs on that day, but by writing letters to them to let them know how we feel. 

General Agents Report

There's no time like the present......

Every council wants to earn Star Council. (You don't win Star, you earn it).....

We all know that there are three benchmarks that need to be hit.

- 1. Programs that make you relevant in your parish and in your community
- 2. Membership growth
- 3. Insurance Promotion

At the mid-year Grand Knights meetings you will learn a great deal that will help you with the first two, so please let me focus on the 3rd component that needs to be "earned". Insurance Promotion, or hitting your insurance quota. This is perhaps the least understood and the hardest to understand, but in essence it comes down to this......meet with your agent.

Your agent can not fulfill Fr. McGivney's dream that no Catholic family suffer financially from the loss of a loved one if you don't meet with him. To earn Star Council the agent must write insurance on a defined number of members who do not own a product from the Knights of Columbus that insures that member's life.

The agent must meet with the members and their spouses to first find out what the family needs. Not every family needs life insurance. Some need disability insurance, some need long term care and others need to save more for retirement through our annuity program. Each family is different and there is no one size fits all answer or product that we can just do.

Fr. McGivney's dream was that the Order would make sure families were protected. It is the job of the agent to work with the member (and his spouse) to find the "need" and provide solutions that make sense for the member and his family. We don't peddle policies, we help the member plan out a strategy and program that will take care of the family in the short term and long term.

That is why we try to meet with all of our assigned families on a regular basis. Life happens, things change and there is not time like the present to get started protecting your family and helping your council "earn" Star.

May the New Year bring each of you happiness, health and prosperity.
