In Memorium - Charles V. McCormick:

Charlie McCormick was known by many titles: Lance Corporal; Sailor/Waterman; Educator; Principle; Knight of Columbus and Sir Knight.

But to those who knew him best he was simply known as Charlie.

Charlie McCormick was one of those "Most Unforgettable Characters" you read about in Reader's Digest. Although there was no such thing as having a two-minute conversation with Charlie, he was totally engaging. I often wondered how one man could cram so many experiences into one lifetime. Yes, Charlie tried to

live life to the fullest.

Charlie joined the Knights of Columbus in March of 2011. He immediately became fully engaged getting involved with projects and volunteering for nearly every activity in one capacity or another. By the end of his first year he had already become a Fourth Degree Knight and was certified as a Color Corps Sir Knight. He strove to attend every Color Corps event.

He was generous with his time and talents and became an Outside Guard and then Chancellor for the Third Degree. He also stepped up and took the office of Pilot for the Fourth Degree. As Chancellor, Charlie was in his heyday as he loved telling potential candidates why they should join the Knights and actively engaged current Knights to tell them why they should take the next degree. There was no escaping Charlie.

Charlie had a huge heart he especially had a soft spot for children. When I first approached Charlie about getting involved with the Courage Lion Program that helps children cope with traumatic illnesses or circumstances, he and Nora were all in and they took the lead for this important program.

And then there were the priests. Charlie has long admired and revered priests and always sought ways to assist the various priests he knew. The Knights dedication to the priesthood was one of the things that Charlie most admired about the Knights of Columbus.

Charlie found his calling in serving in the Knights of Columbus. Nora would often tell me how happy Charlie was to be a Knight. I don't think there is anyone with more enthusiasm for the Knights than Charlie.

Charlie was a loving husband, a devoted Father, adoring Grandfather and a dedicated Knight. And because he loved the sea, my farewell would be: "Sail on good and faithful servant of God – sail on!"

Some news about the time requirement for becoming a Fourth Degree Knight ...

The Supreme Master announced that the Supreme Board of Directors has approved the elimination of the six month requirement as a member of the Knights of Columbus to become a member of the Fourth Degree, if the candidate is a third degree member in good standing. Basically, this means that a waiver of the sixmonth requirement is no longer needed to take the Fourth Degree.

The next Fourth Degree Exemplification will be May 18, 2013 at St. Leo's in Fairfax. It should be a one-day event.
