## Holy Name of Jesus



The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, which is celebrated on January 3. The first eleven days of January fall during the liturgical season known as Christmas which is represented by the liturgical color white.

The name "Jesus" was a common one among the Israelites at the time of Jesus' birth and it means "Yahweh saves." Among ancient peoples a name expressed the person's place in the universe or it could also express a man's activity or destiny. Jesus came to save His people from their sins." This is His special role. He saves them from the guilt of sin, by cleansing them in His own atoning blood. He saves them from the dominion of sin by putting in their hearts the sanctifying Spirit. He saves them from the presence of sin, when He takes them out of this world to rest with Him. He will save them from all the consequences of sin, when He shall give them a glorious body at the last day.

The Son of God (Jesus) is content to call Himself Savior. Those seeking salvation may draw near to the Father with boldness, and have access with confidence through Christ. It is His role and His delight to show mercy. "For God didn't send his Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world should be saved through him."

The Holy Name of Jesus is, first of all, an all-powerful prayer. Our Lord Himself solemnly promises that whatever we ask the Father in His Name we shall receive. God never fails to keep His word. When, therefore, we say, "Jesus," let us ask God for all we need with absolute confidence of being heard. For this reason, the Church ends her prayer with the words, "through Jesus Christ," which gives the prayer a new and Divine efficacy.

Each time we say, "Jesus," we give God infinite joy and glory, for we offer Him all the infinite merits of the Passion and Death of Jesus Christ. Each time we say "Jesus," it is an act of perfect love, for we offer to God the infinite love of Jesus.

As we dedicate this month of January, let's offer our lives to the Holy Name of Jesus to ask for His protection and saving power as we pray:

**O God, Who didst make Thy only-begotten Son the Savior of the human race, and didst command Him to be called Jesus, grant propitiously that Him whose holy Name we venerate on earth, we may behold in the glorious vision of heaven. Who with Thee liveth and reigneth forever and ever. Amen.**

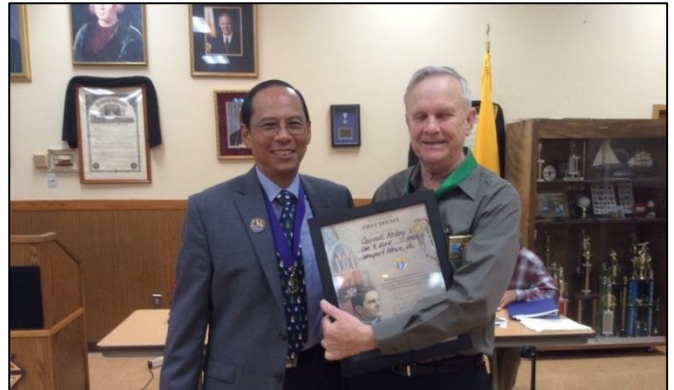
