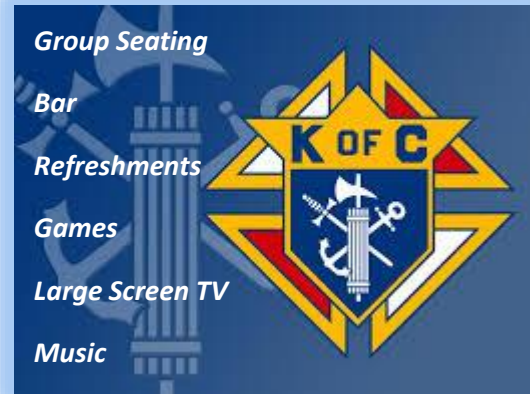

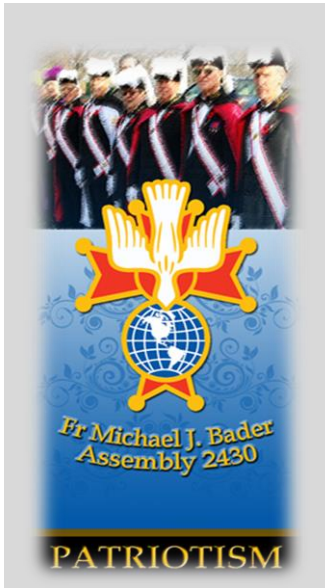

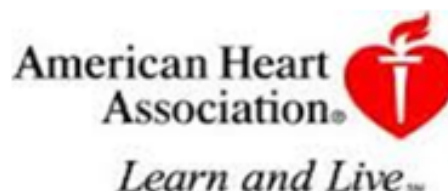

Come join us at Founder's Hall (building in the back) every Thursday from 6-6:45 to learn true self-defense.

When you hear the term "martial arts", you may think of Tae Kwon Do, Karate or the now popular Mixed Martial Arts (MMA). These are martial arts practiced for tournaments and scoring points. They are good for learning basic techniques and discipline. What we practice is Kenpo. Kenpo is a real, practical self-defense style that teaches discipline, coordination, and self-defense. We work on building confidence, self-discipline, and respect for others.

By practicing in the "satellite program" in Founder's Hall, you are considered a member of the main school located in Hampton and invited to all of the seminars, socials, and special events that we have. Also, you are welcome to try out some of the other programs offered by the school. We have had a few students that have enjoyed the program at the main school so much that they have switched over to have access to more classes.

This program is not just for kids. We have almost as many adults students at the main school as younger students and we have had a few adults in the satellite program (some of our other satellite programs have more adults than kids).

If you have any questions about the program (satellite or main school), please don't hesitate to give me a call or just come by on Thursday night (come by early to talk and take care of some paperwork). The only cost for classes are \$5 a week. There is a testing fee of \$30 per test. This is a small fraction of the cost of other schools and you will be getting a practical self-defense program.
