

Fish Fry time is rapidly approaching, Lent is earlier this year than normal. This is one of our largest fundraisers throughout the year. Like last year, we would like to request that you sign up using the SignUp Genius website. To access the signup please follow this link:

The more people we get to volunteer, the better we can spread out the work. We'd like you to consider working a minimum of two of the dinners or even more if you can work it into your schedule and enjoy helping out. Wives are also invited to sign up along with your children if they are in 6th grade or above. Younger children will not be allowed to assist with beer, cashiers, or the fry tent. Please signup any family members on the singup site as well. It takes over 60 people for our fish fry to be successful. This year the dates for the fish frys are:

Last year we served over 1000 dinners on several nights, our goal this year is to reach 1000+ dinners on all 6 nights, this can only happen with all your great volunteer help.

Attached at the end of the newsletter is a flyer that you can share with your friends, coworkers, neighbors etc, about our fish frys.

We plan to keep our prices the same as last year for our dinners and beverage sales. The prices will be \$ 9 for Adults, \$8 for seniors, and \$6 for Kids (age 4-12), but remember if your volunteering you eat free that night. Our beverage prices will remain at \$8 for either a pitcher of beer or bottle of wine. Glass prices will be \$3 each. All prices include the sales taxes.

Serving time is 5:30 PM each Friday. Please arrive early (4:30ish) if you can to help with setup. One area on the singup that we are always short on and could use some volunteers for is the cleanup crew, if you are not available early on a Friday night, why not come out and have some fish and beer then help with clean up after the serving line finishes. The serving line deserves a break when finished to have some dinner too. Afterwards all the workers and the cleanup crew will work together to get things cleaned up .
