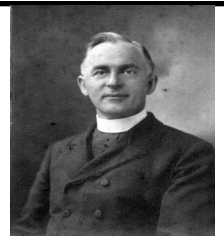

Chaplain's Reflection Clergy Abuse Scandal

Jesus told his disciples, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." This is absolutely true. But sometimes, the gravely unholy actions of a very small minority of our clergy can raise doubts. After all, our priests act "in persona Christi" and both our priests and deacons are configured to "Christ the servant."

This issue of clergy sanctity actually dates back to 4th century. St. Augustine disapproved of the ministry of notorious sinners among the clergy and attested to their degradation from the clerical state. However, he maintained that like all actual sin, clerical sin is personal. It cannot spiritually contaminate others by association. Moreover, the priest's sins, no matter how grave, never impede the Church's holiness. Sacramental efficacy does not depend upon the cleric's uncompromised moral status within the ecclesial community.

The Sacraments sanctify because Christ himself is their agent. When a person is baptized, it is in fact Christ who baptizes. When a priest pronounces the words of absolution in the confessional, it is Christ who is forgiving a penitent's sins. When the Eucharist is consecrated, it is by the power of the Holy Spirit that bread and wine are transformed into the body and blood of Christ. The origin of the Church's holiness, therefore, is found in Jesus and not in the cleric's human merits.

Although the abuse scandals plaguing our Holy Church have been analyzed legally, institutionally, psychologically, and culturally, rarely have they been looked at biblically. What does a Biblical reading offer? First, we should not be surprised that people behave badly. The Bible clearly teaches that we human beings have been made in the image and likeness of God and that we are destined for eternal life with God. Nevertheless, it teaches with equal clarity that we are fallen, marked by the original sin which has compromised us in body, mind and will.

The Scriptural narratives are remarkably honest about this. They make reference to rape, theft, murder, jealous rages, palace intrigue, naked ambition, family dysfunction, political corruption, adultery and, yes, sexual abuse. More to it, many of these crimes are committed by God's chosen instruments: Saul, David, Solomon, Jacob, Peter, Paul and John, to name just a handful.

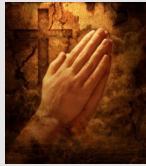

Why does this happen? From a Biblical perspective, sin is the most fundamental and clarifying response.

Second, the Church has enemies. The message of God's love is not one that is necessarily received with enthusiasm by a sinful world; just the contrary. The sexual abuse of children is not new. It is a plague that has been around throughout the ages. Jesus said, "heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not." Biblically minded people should understand that the moral compass of the Church cannot be corrupted by sins of its clergy or the laity.

Third, God regularly - and sometimes harshly - chastises his people Israel in order to cleanse them. On the biblical reading, God raises up figures who name the sins of the nation and call its leaders to repentance and reform. We might consider Samuel (who challenged Saul), Nathan (who called out David), Isaiah (who railed against the temple establishment), Jeremiah (who took the leadership of Israel to task) and Jesus himself (who had a few things to say about "whitewashed sepulchers").

Not everyone who brought the clergy sex scandal to light is an enemy of the church. Many should be understood as instruments of God's vengeance, who is compelling a reluctant church to come to grips with a problem that it has had for far too long to be ignored, brushed under the carpet or handled with pathetic incompetence.

I think that it's good to study this terrible phenomenon as thoroughly as we can, but we should never forget that the most clarifying perspective is the one provided by God's holy word.
