

The rosary is important for the Knights yet some Knights don't know how to pray it. Mechanically reciting a bunch of Hail Mary's is not what the rosary is. The Hail Marys' are just "background music" while you think about the mysteries. But unless you know a lot about the mysteries you won't have much to think about. So to say a good rosary you should at least read what the Bible has to say about the mysteries.

The sorrowful mysteries are easy. Your imagination comes into play with mysteries. For example it's easy to place yourself at Jesus side while he is in the garden experiencing his agony or to walk with Him on the way of the cross imaging His pain and the jeers of the crowd.

Other mysteries need a little more effort either from the Bible or Catholic websites about the mysteries. It's the mysteries that are the real rosary. The Hail Marys' are just background music so to speak. There are books with lots of material to think about for the mysteries. Please look into these so that your rosary is effective and rewarding. We all need prayer and after the Mass the Rosary is our best weapon against evil.
