### **Grand Knight's Report**

<u>Diaper Drive</u> – This was another very successful project on several levels. Steve Isaacson, John Smith and Kevin Brinkman brought a large delivery of donations to the JPII LifeCenter from our parishioners. Many thanks also to Frank Kelly for handling donations at all masses all month. We partnered with the parish on this and want to continue such partnership on as many activities as possible. An integral part of the parish is our goal. The delivery participants toured the facility and as always were very impressed. The staff at JPII noted that they we in danger of running out of many of the items we brought and thus it was particularly appreciated.

<u>Funfest</u> – First Saturday in May, May 2. This May include the Crawfish Boil.

<u>Fish Fry</u> — David Sanchez Sr. reported 15-16 members emailed him to volunteer. The last week of February is our first Fish Fry. There will be a Fish Fry meeting Jan 28 at Rudy's at 7 PM. We have permission to put up the roof over our outside cooking area. We need a day to clean the Fryers. This year, we want to get other ministries involved and will have the committee make such decisions when they meet. Man Up wants to help. We can get another ministry to take over the dessert donations, and can use help with clean up for sure.

<u>Christmas Party</u> - **The Christmas Party at the Oasis.** This was a wonderful time and we had a beautiful sunset for the occasion. Fr. Jared was able to attend for a short time before he had to go to St Vincent DePaul for the penance

Golf Tournament — On October 14, Columbus Day, we held the Annual Michael Kelly Golf Tournament to raise funds for STM Mobile Loaves and Fishes. The start was at 12:30 PM at Twin Creeks Country Club. We had a full slate of 145 players (actually one more than full). Thanks to the many volunteers who made this a huge success. Steve Isaacson reported that we raised almost \$14,000 for Mobile Loaves and Fishes and an additional \$2500 retained for other charitable activities of the Council.

### Deputy Grand Knight's Report of Committees

The following plans and suggestions have been presented by the various Directors

#### <u>Community – Dan St Andre – </u>

<u>Essay Contest and Free Throw</u> – Essay contest to be conducted at Life Teen retreat. Essays come to us and we judge. Free Throw will be done in conjunction with Game Night of RE. At the

meeting we approved \$400 for two additional hoops.

Wheelchair – We have already budgeted for one and have funds for another. We can obtain additional for \$150 each; bright yellow with K of C identification. First two will be prominently available at the PAC and Church. We would like to place a donation jar at our meetings to fund more than two.

#### Faith - Michael Yarberry -

Clergy Appreciation Dinner: This event will be Feb 11 at St Helen's. We pay for Priests and Deacons, and their wives and include Fr. Elmer. Cost is \$50. We will pay the additional table cost of \$100 for a table of 8 (and reserve 2 tables). We will also have a gift card of \$25 for each priest and deacon. The Annual Catholic Men's Conference will be Saturday, February 8, 2020 from 8 AM – 4 PM. It will be held at 7311 Decker Ln, Austin, TX 78724; this is the Expo Center off Decker Lane. Cost is \$50 Regular Admission.

<u>Family – David Sanchez Jr.</u> - David reported on ideas being considered. First of all, <u>Food for Families</u>. This is part of the Columbian award, a subset of Star Council award. We must document everything, e.g. how many canned goods, etc. Also, it was noted that our donation to MLF from funds raised at the Golf Tournament qualifies as part of "Food for





Families". Also being pursued is the idea of awarding a <u>Family of the Month Parish Wide</u>. Recommendations would be solicited from each of the parish ministries and then a drawing would select the Family. We are scheduled to run this past Fr. Michael, of course. The submission should include the reason for nomination. <u>Keep Christ in Christmas</u> – We sold magnets Keep Christ in Christmas Magnets in conjunction with Holiday Nut Sales. Finally, there is a requirement for <u>Consecration of the Holy Family</u>. This would involve a mass and could combine with Faith in our Families.

Life - Interim Director Kevin Brinkman- We start with four key ideas. March for Life, January 24, 6+ Knights and 50 people overall, and perhaps inclusion of Life Teen can help with the numbers. Other Ministries include Respect for Life and Project Rachael. The march is downtown to the Capital. Choose Life signs are available free. Pregnancy Center Support. We can do the Sunday drive Lifesaver for Annunciation Maternity Home. Cost is minimal again, around \$100. Additional programs to the four above include a Mass for People with Special Needs, Fatima Rosary in the Park (Oct 12), Ultrasound, and Special Olympics (either \$2,000 or 200 hours). All of the above are listed under the Columbian Award.

<u>Membership – David Sanchez Sr.</u> - We made use of the Ministry Fair in September. There is also a video available, Why We Become Knights that describes projects and fraternity. We could hold a monthly Open House that would also bring in the wives of prospective members. We could have cake and coffee. Using the list of new parishioners as they come in, we could contact them. We could invite potential members to our social. Overall, we need a soft approach so we

know that potential members understand what we do and are committed to be a part of our activities, not just to get a name on the role. Everyone has someone they know who they can ask and sponsor, which represents a great potential.

<u>Retention – Steve Haecker</u> – Steve has pulled together a committee to make contacts periodically. We split up the membership list and each of the committee members is telephoning to inquire what we can do for them to get them involved with us again. We want to first of all determine if they are in need of anything, i.e. perhaps a health issue.
