

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN, REVEREND MARTIN VALLELY



Dear Brothers.

Here's praying that you and those you love will have every blessing and happiness in this New Year 2017. I pray that your faith may grow strong, your trust in Our Lord never waver, and your outreach of love to others be a flowing river of goodness and healing.

We all know that these are interesting and difficult times in which we live. It is important for us to get our priorities straight, to put our trust in what really lasts, not in what is passing and fading. At the dawn of a New Year, when people traditionally make resolutions and are determined to better their lives, I suggest that we make a couple of spiritual resolutions.....nothing enormously burdensome, but the sort of thing that will keep us on track.

By all accounts the evening was a huge success with all who attended leaving for home with more than they came, including thinner wallets.


Special thanks to the many volunteers, without whose help the activity would not have been possible. Our Brother Knights should all be very proud of their efforts in making this great event a huge success.




