BUILDING THE DOMESTIC CHURCH BELIEVING IN THE FAMILY

The November Chaplain's Report carried an excellent article on "Building the Domestic Church: Believing in the Family". As you may know, the Directors of the Knights of Columbus have undertaken to look for ways to build the domestic Church. The first place to begin is in the Family.

I would like to share with my Brother Knights some of the insights that were printed in this article. "Do you believe in the family?" Every Sunday, during the Creed, we proclaim that we believe in God the Father Almighty, in Jesus Christ his Son and in the Holy Spirit. We believe in One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church......but the family is not mentioned among the articles of our faith.

In 1981, St. John Paul II wrote in his diary that a "lack of confidence in the family is the first cause of the crisis of the family." When we see weaknesses and struggles of the family today, we may lose our hope in the family. The articles goes on to say that the best way to recover confidence in the family is to consider the ways of God. We trust in the family, because God trusts in the family. The "Building the Domestic Church: The Family Fully Alive" initiative exists because we believe in the family. Do we believe in the family? God ways are inviting us, as shepherds of his sheep, to believe in the vocation of the family, the Domestic Church. The Glory of God is the family fully alive.
