As we begin January and, hence, another year on the civil calendar, we find ourselves still in the Christmas season of the liturgy. Does the Christmas season end after twelve days with the Feast of the Epiphany? The Ordo, which you will find in the sacristy of each Church, says that the Christmas season ends with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. An older liturgical tradition includes the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2 in the Christmas season. Like so much of the rest of the traditional story of Christmas, the gospel account of the presentation of Jesus in the Temple is taken from the second chapter of the Gospel according to St. Luke. This feast is also the traditional time of blessing candles in the Church and so is also known as Candlemas.

As the dark season of the year continues, but also as the daylight grows, we celebrate yet another of the liturgical feasts in which the imagery of light is particularly important. As a spiritual preparation this month, I would suggest praying the Canticle of Simeon which is found in verses 29-32 of the second chapter of Luke. It is usually said at bedtime. On Epiphany, we collect diapers in infant sizes for the Center for Pregnancy Choices. That would be a fitting corporal work for the month of January as we remember Jesus as an infant.

Extra from John Harwell on Dues



Our Financial Secretary, Rick Norman, will or may have already mailed out our 2017 dues statements. If you pay before March 31st it is \$20 for those members over 26 years of age but under 65 years of age who live in town; \$12 for out of town members; \$10 for students, active duty military, policemen, and those under the age of 26. Council 802 doesn't charge those members age 65 or older.

Do you realize what a bargain this is? If you and/or your family only attend one function during the year you have already gotten your money's worth. Of course we have dozens of activities, programs, dinners, picnics, etc. throughout the course of the year that easily makes this a worthwhile investment. Going back in history, in 1903, when our council was chartered (the first in the state of Mississippi), dues were \$1.75 per quarter for a total of \$7.00 a year. That was a large sum of money in those days. If our dues had increased with the rate of inflation over the last 114 years our dues should now be about \$175 a year. What a bargain we get!

Please do not procrastinate, get your dues payment back into Rick promptly. It is easily the best money you will spend this year! By the way, after March 31st \$20 becomes \$30, \$12 becomes \$18, and \$10 goes to \$15. So, you can see that you are receiving a 33% discount by paying early. So, do (due) not be late!!

Quickly name as many movies and TV shows as you can in the past 20 years that portray the Catholic Church, her priests and religious, or her faithful followers in a positive light. How many could you think of? Need more time? Okay take a few minutes..I will wait.

#### How about now?

How many did you name? Not too many I bet? That's because, sadly, so few actually exist. The Catholic Church is painted more negatively and mocked more freely by the media than any other religion or denomination of Christianity. Priest and nuns are painted in broad negative strokes, casting shadows of mistrust and mockery upon their heroic sacrifices. Lay Catholics are normally painted as being mental simpletons who cannot think for themselves and are under the "oppressive mind control" of the evil Church hierarchy. Occasionally, you might see a likeable Catholic, but they normally end up being over-zealous or "enlightened" (meaning that they know better than the Church).

There are many reasons we could point to for these sad realities. Some Catholics who have left the church are in need of healing and we need to pray for them and invite them back home. Others function out of total ignorance of what the Church is really about and what She really teaches. We need to reach out to them in humility and love and educate them. Still others are intimidated by the Church's honesty and don't like the Church forcing them to take a difficult look at their own lives.

A few years back there was a survey conducted by the Center for Media and Public Affairs in Washington DC. It was a survey of the top 100 media executives in the US. These 100 people controlled most of what we read, hear, and see on a daily basis. They have the final say in what the general public does and does not see. The following bullet points are facts drawn out of the survey they answered:

- 93% seldom or never go to religious services
- 97% support abortion
- 80% don't view homosexual acts as wrong
- 51% don't regard adultery as wrong

This survey alludes to a general trend in some very powerful positions. Some of the most fundamental truths that Catholics defend are not only called into question, but are denounced by very influential people. As a Catholic, you have an opportunity to spread God's truth. The power is yours. What you choose to watch, listen to, and spend your money on is your right. Speak out against people or media that slander your faith. I told you all this to point out a show on ABC called the "Real O'Neals". Our Supreme Knight has asked all Knights to ask ABC to cancel the show. Why? Because in the first two-episodes alone, there were 93 separate visual or verbal reminders that this was a show making fun of Catholics, and 8 admissions of Catholic sins. It was just renewed for another season even though its ratings are low. In fact, several shows with much better ratings were cancelled. Could it be because ABC has an axe to grind with the Catholic Church? We know the producer does. He has repeatedly said many evil things about the Church that I will not repeat, but feel free to google it. You would be surprised and very disappointed. So please respond to our Supreme Knight's request and email ABC and ask them to cancel this very anti-Catholic show.
