Computer Tips

WHEN IS IT TIME TO GET A NEW COMPUTER?

Whenever someone has something wrong with their computer the question arises, "Is it time to buy a new one?"

Here are some things to think about.

- 1. How old is your current computer?
- 2. Has it been accomplishing what you want?
- 3. What do you have attached to your computer?
- 4. Does it make sense to buy or upgrade/repair?
- 5. Do You just want a new one?

I consider a new computer when it reaches 5 years old. New computers will most likely have a faster processor, come with a new operating system (OS), more random access memory (RAM) and a larger hard drive not to mention other additions that you may not have (such as an installed card reader for your camera SD cards).

If you are ready for a new computer, how powerful does the new one need to be? If the one you have been using has been doing the job (e-mail, Internet, writing letters) then no need to get the most powerful available.

Scanners, printers and other things you have attached to your computer require "drivers" to translate what the computer is telling them to do. Drivers are specific to operating systems and whether they are 32-bit or 64-bit. So, you will need to know if the equipment you have attached to your old computer will work with the new one or be prepared to purchase a new printer (or other equipment) as well.

Repair, upgrade or buy new? For me it is simply a matter of cost and satisfaction. You will have to determine whether the cost justifies keeping the old computer or buying new. Computers have come down in price significantly so it can be a tough decision sometimes.

Because the cost of new computers has come down so much you might just want a new one. Before you run out and get that great deal, remember about the peripherals attached to your current computer. More questions? Send me an e-mail and I will answer best I can. Happy computing!

This year's Breakfast with Santa event went very well. Santa's helpers provided a scrumptious breakfast for all the parents and anxious children.






Mirabai says that the Mother appears when we need her most. So,
