

THE TURTLE RACE

Our annual TURTLE RACE is planned and ready to go. The tickets are in hand and the council's thoroughbred racing turtles are fully trained and ready. We now need YOU to help sell the tickets at Dunkin Donuts on and other locations on Friday, Saturday and Sunday July 18 through 20. On July 20 we will also be selling the tickets at the "Festa Italiana".



Contact Mark Welch to help at (708) 479 4763. Selling tickets for the turtle race can be a lot of fun for a family.

The TURTLE RACE has up to 1,000 inflatable turtles floating down Marley Creek. A numbered turtle that matches the number of each ticket is entered into the race. If 650 tickets are sold then 650 turtles are in the creek, etc. The first turtle to finish pays \$500 to the holder of the matching numbered ticket. Second place pays \$200 and third place \$100. Fourth through seventh place pay \$50 and 8th through 10th pay \$25. The race is at 1 PM, July 26 and the finish line is the foot bridge at about 11500 W. 191st Street (Go past the Creamery west on 191st Street)

Volunteers are needed to set up for the race starting at 10 AM on Saturday July 26. Contact Mark if you can help or just show up. During the race, volunteers dump the turtles into the creek behind the Mokena water treatment plant and some then follow the racing turtles as "herders" to dislodge any that get stuck on a branch. At the finish line more volunteers catch the turtles for next year's race. It is a lot of fun with teenagers often helping as "herders" and "catchers". Come and join in!

The Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel

Some Chicago parishes have celebrated the feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, patroness of the Carmelite Order, for many years. This year, the feast comes to Mokena!

The Procession

The feast will start with a procession from St Mary Cemetery, through town, to the festival on Front Street. A statue of Our Lady will lead the procession behind the Fourth Degree honor guard. A tram will carry those who have difficulty

walking and every one else will follow behind, saying the rosary of Our Lady. Classic Italian music will be heard from the tram The Procession will leave St Mary Cemetery at 11:30 AM on July 20. and will travel east from the cemetery, south on Division Street and then west on Front Street. The Party

The "Festa Italiana" starts when the procession reaches the party tent on Front Street. EXPLANATION

As a retired project manager, I look at construction projects differently than most others. My image of a construction project looks at limits on cost overruns and changes during construction as well as design. It was with this perspective that I wrote in May about the construction projects guided by Father Jim Dvorscak at St Mary.

One of our brothers was offended that I described the project to build a new gymnasium, offices and classrooms as "huge and badly designed". I offer the following explanation:

The project that Father Jim was "handed" when he was sent to St Mary had some serious flaws. It had been approved by the Diocese but needed significant and costly changes. It was found that the original design used rooftop air conditioning units that had to be removed and replaced with units mounted inside the building. A new basement was added to the building at a cost of \$400,000 and the architectural, mechanical and electrical designs had to be redone to accommodate the change. The building's design was also not legal under federal disability laws and had to be extensively modified again to add three elevators for access by the disabled. Other lesser changes rounded out the picture.

Change orders are a significant source of income for architects, engineers and contractors. When a change is made, a partial credit is returned for previous planning and material already purchased or ordered. A premium is usually charged for new blueprints and rush orders for new materials, and so on. The changes made to the St Mary project added millions to the final cost. In fact, when the project was finished, the Parish had no money or credit left for furniture, which caused the "Columbian Club" to present Father Jim with a check for \$5,000.

I have no quarrel with those who managed the construction effort for our parish. Their work is not under discussion here and was not an issue. If some of those in charge of the project for St Mary Parish feel offended, I hope this article explains my perspective and I apologize for hurt feelings. Joost Sluis

Many of us have seen the movie "For Greater Glory" about the uprising by Catholics in

You have to cook your own steak on the large charcoal grill. The steak fry starts at 5:30 PM and all are welcome to join the knights in their dinner.

This is the third year that the Joliet Assembly has hosted the Patriotic Rosary. This year more bad news has come to the Church from our anti Christian government. It is becoming more and more important that we publicly express our Faith in prayer and witness. Do your part! Pray at restaurants openly. Join religious processions whenever you can. 
