## The Importance of Planning and Prioritizing

1. A scheme, program, or method worked out beforehand for the accomplishment of an objective: a plan of attack.

**Planning** [also called **forethought**] is the process of thinking about and organizing the activities required to **achieve desired goals**.



Here in the Knights of Columbus, **planning is a function of our leaders**, who are concerned with defining the path for New Jersey's future direction and determining what is needed to achieve our Council and State Council **targeted goals**. As we begin a new Columbian year, let's **ALL** get together and look at why we need to start planning **NOW**, especially if you haven't already done so. **Why plan you ask?** 

**Planning increases the efficiency** of our State Council and your local council:

- It facilitates proper **coordination** within State and local Council staff;
- It aids in organizing all available resources;
- It gives our organization the right direction to take;
- It helps to achieve our **objectives**;
- It motivates the Officers and members; and
- It encourages **creativity and innovation** amongst our leaders.

The concept of planning is to identify what we want to accomplish by asking ourselves the following four questions, which are "Where are we today? Where are we going? Where do we want to go? How are we going to get there?..." Planning is the most important part of the formula to help us answer these questions.

Some of you say, "I don't have time to do any planning," or "Things change too much to plan!" But the fact is: research shows that for every 1 minute you spend in planning, you will gain 10 in execution. 1 minute = 10 minutes. 10 minutes = 1 hour and 40 minutes! This may seem amazing because you may feel like you are already doing all you can each day! Okay, let's do the math. If you could just gain an extra half-hour a day through effective time management, you would have 22 more days available to you per year.

Planning and prioritizing will without question keep you "On Target" in achieving your goals and objectives.

Abraham Lincoln reportedly once said, "If I had 60 minutes to cut down a tree, I would spend 40 minutes sharpening the ax and 20 minutes cutting it down."

In conclusion; you have to **take time to make time**. Planning is the difference between being **REACTIVE** and **PROACTIVE**. When you don't plan, you end up responding to events as they occur. **So, I ask you.......**

In addition, each Grand Knight who holds at least 3 First Degrees from July 1, 2014 through **September 30, 2014** will also receive that same type of shirt as a reward. For the Grand Knight to receive a shirt, he must let his District Deputy know that the First Degrees were held. The District Deputy will in fill turn out his District Deputy Degree Exemplification Report Form 450 and send a copy to Supreme, to the State Council, to the Membership Program Director and keep a copy for himself. The deadline for the final submission for these programs is October 7, 2014.

# Culture of Life Corner

#### **Brothers:**

We stand now at the beginning of a new Columbian Year. This is an opportunity to start afresh and look for ways to do an even better job of **re-establishing a Culture of Life by Proclaiming and Defending Our Faith**. I just hope that you do not delay in starting to do so during the summer months.

I realize that many councils either shut down completely in July and August or meet less frequently. If this is something your council does, please consider not doing so this year. Our Churches are open all year, our priests are working hard, and they need our help. If they do not take a vacation from charitable works, why should we?

We have had a great start for the **Disabilities Drive** this year, which kicked off with a bang in April. I am pleased to report that we have already **raised \$249,592.90** with only 91 councils participating. This comes down to a little more than \$2,700 per council! We need another big push this summer from our councils in shore communities to get another big hit like the one in April. From Sandy Hook to Cape May, let's get out there and get those donations from the shoobies! If they have money for Skee-Ball, they have money to help the disabled! We are a quarter of the way through the year, and a quarter of the way towards our **\$1 million goal!** 

The summer is also a great time to **plan some fundraisers for life**. Hold a rose sale at your parish. If you do it now, you can hold another on in November and December for money to defray the cost of busses for your march on Washington. Plan a **Baby Bottle Boomerang** to raise money for **Pregnant Women in Crisis! Brother Tony Bernice** tells me that there has been a significant drop in donations in the last year or two. These crisis centers need our help, so let's redouble our efforts!

How about raising money by making a personal statement about your pro-life beliefs by getting a **Choose Life license plate** for your car? Support the **Children First Foundation** and get more information through this **LINK** on how to apply for this plate. This does involve a commitment to make a donation of \$25 every year, but \$20 of that goes to help fund 66 **Pregnancy Resource Centers** and **Maternity Homes** throughout our state as well as non-profit **Safe Haven** efforts.

Finally, we must continue to speak out on pro-life issues, especially on all that is happening with the "New Jersey Aid in Dying for the Terminally III Act," formerly known as the "Death with Dignity Act." Unfortunately, euthanasia by any other name is still murder! We need more people to participate in Our Catholic Voice in the Media and write letters to the newspapers. Remember that in Unity there is no limit to the miracles that we can accomplish! Let's get to work!






## GRAND KNIGHTS & NEWSLETTER EDITORS

## **Independence Day**



In 1775, people in New England began fighting the British for their independence. On July 2, 1776, the Congress

secretly voted for independence from Great Britain. The Declaration of Independence was first published two days later on July 4, 1776. The first public reading of the Declaration was on July 8, 1776. Delegates began to sign it on August 2, 1776.





The first description of how **Independence Day** would be celebrated was in a letter from John Adams to his wife Abigail on July 3, 1776. He described "pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires and illuminations" throughout the United States. However, the term "Independence Day" was not used until 1791.

Interestingly, **Thomas Jefferson and John Adams**, both signers of the Declaration of Independence and presidents of the United States, died on July 4, 1826 – exactly fifty 50 years after the adoption of the declaration.
