SILVER ROSE IS COMING TO KEARNEY

The Knights of Columbus of Nebraska will participate in a North American effort paying special tribute to Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas through the Silver Rose Program. This program involves carrying a Silver Rose from Saskatchewan through the U.S. to Monterrey, Mexico. Six roses will travel simultaneously through 31 jurisdictions and Mexico. The program concludes in Mexico on Dec. 12, 2015, the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Rose will journey through Nebraska between August 2 and August 29 beginning in Scottsbluff and ending in Falls City.
