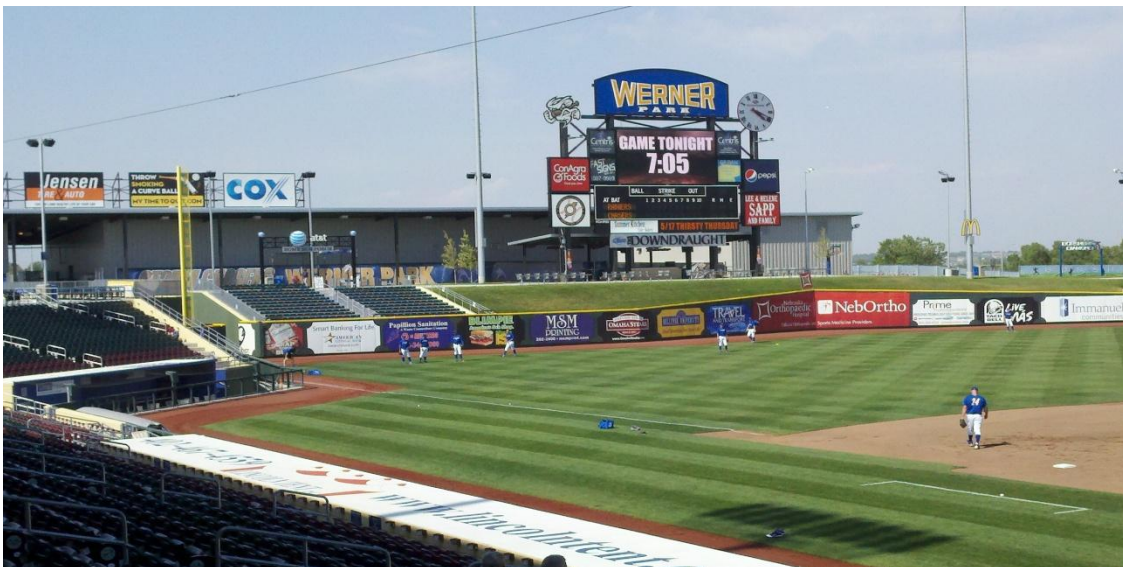


SVdP Knights Day at the Ballpark Who is Ready to watch some Baseball

A Founding Notion Protecting the Breadwinner's Income
