## Grand Knight Message




 Welcome to the new Fraternal Year! It is an honor to be able to serve Council 5480 as the Grand Knight. This year, we are going to focus on engaging our membership. The first principle of the Order is Charity. As long as I can remember Council 5480 primarily conducts charity through gifts of money using the profits from our Monday and Thursday Night Bingo sessions. This year there are two fundamental changes to Bingo operations. First, Monday Night volunteers from OLMC are true volunteers without compulsory service. Second, starting August 1st the Columbian Center, including Bingo operations, will be smoke free. Depending on your perspective, these are encouraging or frightful changes; I chose to be encouraged. I need your help in the form of service. Without a mandatory slate of six OLMC floor workers, I need Brother Knights to fill those spots. In order to bridge this area, I am asking that each Knight that doesn't already serve volunteer at least two four-hour shifts this entire Fraternal Year. In other words, come work as a floor worker two nights, Monday or Thursday, between now and July 2018. If we have 100 percent compliance, that works out to over seven additional volunteers per Bingo session. Lastly, an update for the Knightly News. As Grand Knight I have invited representatives from SPRED and Commonwealth Catholic Charities to submit articles to our newsletter. Both groups represent people that normally don't have a voice, but deserve the same consideration that we enjoy. Please read their articles and prayerfully consider participating in their events.

**Only Having Insurance "Through Work" Doesn't Work**



Do you know anyone whose life or career has drastically changed during these years of economic downturn?

It's very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or group of friends is facing financial uncertainty. Maybe there's a possibility that you (or your spouse) could change employers, or even lose your job.

Too many people have often relied on group term life insurance as their only safety net. Often, this insurance is an employee benefit provided at low or no cost. 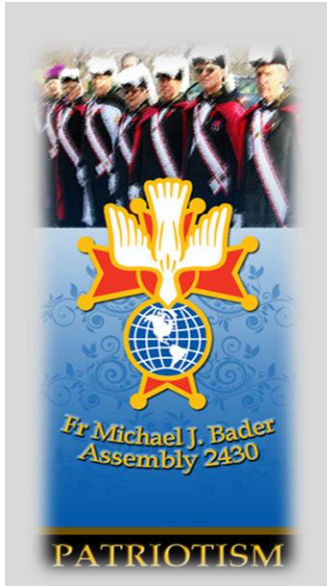

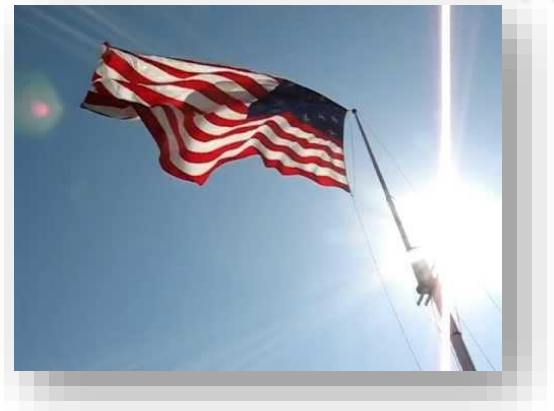

## *SPRED the News*

In the Book of God's Word, Saint Paul proclaims, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service, but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces them in everyone" (1Cor. 12: 4-6 NABRE). Beautifully, SPRED (Special Religious Development) communities throughout the world proclaim this good news. In SPRED, people with and without intellectual disabilities come together, equally, respectful of each person's unique gifts, to live as necessary members of the Body of Christ.

In 1960, Father James McCarthy, serving as the Archdiocese of Chicago's Associate Director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, began to imagine how the Church could more fully welcome her members of all ages with intellectual and developmental disabilities. He had learned that parents of people with disabilities were concerned that their parishes were not meeting the needs of their children. Along with Sister Mary Therese Harrington, S.H., Father McCarthy began, intensely, to look for authentic ways fully to welcome intellectually disabled people to the sacraments and to catechesis. They embraced a method of symbolic catechesis, developed in France, and from that SPRED evolved. SPRED communities are carefully prepared environments, which allow Christians with and without disabilities to grow and to worship together in equal dignity in the presence of God. Symbolic catechesis permits us to approach God individually and together, as the diverse people we are, not primarily through the intellect, but through affect. Catechists and Friends with intellectual and developmental disabilities, supported by the prepared environment of SPRED, become Church by permitting enjoyable activities to quiet us and empty us, alone together. Then, we let the life of God's Word fill us. And, finally, we rejoice at a beautifully prepared table, sharing delicious food, in God's abundant love, reflected in our fellowship.

Slowly, the beauty of the SPRED method is spreading around the world and transforming parishes. And in 2011, Deacon David Dwyer, having experienced SPRED in Chicago, invited the Diocese of Richmond to become part of SPRED, and Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish in Newport News began preparing catechists and space according to the SPRED method. Although, sadly, Deacon Dwyer is now deceased, his son Patrick continues as a Friend in one of three SPRED groups thriving at OLMC, which welcome 18 adult Friends in companionship with 24 Catechists. And, guided by Deacon Dwyer's vision, SPRED Partners of Virginia, Inc. continues to encourage parishes throughout the Diocese of Virginia to come see the ways in which SPRED is enriching the lives of our Friends, their families, SPRED Catechists, and the entire Church in the Diocese of Richmond. SPRED Partners of Virginia, Inc. hopes to inspire parishes throughout the Diocese of Richmond to welcome children and adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities, their families, and catechists into carefully prepared SPRED environments. Echoing the hope of Deacon Dave, SPRED Partners of Virginia, Inc. invites you to let us show you how special SPRED really is:
