Chaplain's Reflection Christ the Good Shepherd

The image of Christ as the Good Shepherd was the favorite depiction of Jesus in the early days of the Church. This is simply astonishing insofar as shepherds were at the very bottom of the social ladder in the ancient world. They were uneducated, illiterate, dirty, smelly, rough and irreligious men. Yet, the image of Jesus as the "good shepherd" tells us quite a bit about what He wants our relationship with him to be like.

A pastor at a small church in the cattle country of Texas was once reminded of this when one of the "cowboys" in his parish said to him, "You know, Father there's a reason Jesus never said: 'I am the good cowboy.'" Cows, he explained, are very obstinate creatures. To get them going in the right direction, they need to be pushed and poked from behind, sometimes with an electric prodder!

Sheep, however, are very different from cows. When they hear their shepherd's call, they happily follow his lead. Just like Jesus said in today's gospel: "My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me." In other words, Jesus doesn't want to have to push us like cows. Instead, he wants us to follow him like sheep.

The shepherd symbol has many different interpretations in the gospel narratives. All of these emphasize the intimacy between Jesus and his followers, an intimacy which continues even today. Jesus knows us as the shepherd knows his sheep. Jesus searches for lost souls the same way the shepherd searches for his lost sheep. Jesus is the one shepherd who is also the gate for his sheep. There is only one fold and Jesus alone is our means of access to the Father. Through Jesus we come to the Father. Through Jesus the Father comes to us.

The world seeks the meaning of life in all manner of things that will not last. The world views pleasure and possessions, power and prestige as defining success and failure, and the meaning of life. But Jesus tells us today that He is the only one who can help us discern the meaning of this life,

We live with a never-ending bombardment of messages and blandishments from the mass media, social media and Hollywood trying to tell us what we need, what we should want, how we should live and eat and drink, dress and ride, what cereals are healthier, what fashions are cooler, what best relieves pain, what best takes off our weight, what will make us more attractive and popular with others, what is the gateway to happiness.

And almost without knowing it, we begin to believe these pitchmen of profit and prolificacy. Their din drowns out the only sound we need to hear. Unheard is the voice of the Good Shepherd who calls his sheep, who shows them the way. The competing calls of hawking hucksters send static into the channels of grace through which we yearn to hear the voice of love and care, compassion and forgiveness, reconciliation, pardon and peace.

Jesus is our gateway to God. Jesus is the only gateway to the Father. Jesus is our shepherd whose voice we *need* to hear over the maddening roar of the world around us. Our Good Shepherd wants to say to each of us this day, "Quiet yourself, withdraw for some moments away from all the other voices and blandishments. Give me, your God, a chance to have access to you. Give me a clear channel and open gate, to enter into the reality of who you are so that I can help you and heal you, give you peace, and with the bread of life nurture you on your way."

What do you know of the Pope's Swiss Guards in Vatican City? They are quite noticeable as they are dressed in the 15th Century Swiss Army uniform of striped blue and orange with a blue beret or a steel helmet and breast plate. They carry medieval era weapons of swords and lances. They have served as the Pope's bodyguards for over 500 years. On May 6, 1527, Rome was invaded and sacked by a German army of 22,000. The 200 Guards defending Pope Clement VII moved him from the Vatican to nearby Castle Saint Angelo, Roman Emperor Hadrian's old fortress, where they held out for over a month against repeated attacks. 147 of the 200 guards died defending Pope Clement. The historic faithfulness and courage of these guards was never forgotten. Each year on the May 6 anniversary, the present day guards stand in military formation in St. Peter's Square and pledge an oath of loyalty and allegiance to the Pope. Today, they are members of a trained elite military unit and are proficient in the use of modern automatic weapons while still maintaining skills in the use of a sword.
