The Knights of Council 5073 raised **\$1,475** for the walk itself, which amounted to approximately 9% of the total funds that were raised for the Walk for Life Campaign.

Council 5073 came in fourth overall out of 12 fundraising teams and higher than any of the 12 individual fundraisers. As a first year participant, that's a great accomplishment that those of you who contributed, can indeed be very proud of.
