The Grand Knight's Corner

My Brother Knights:

This month we are celebrating our Independence. Numbers of people in other countries cannot say they are free. Our forefathers fought for rights they didn't have and won. Here is a little trivia. Enjoy!

Independence Day, commonly known as the Fourth of July, is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, declaring independence from the Kingdom of Great Britain (now officially known as the United Kingdom). Independence Day is commonly associated with fireworks, parades, barbecues, carnivals, fairs, picnics, concerts, baseball games, family reunions, and political speeches and ceremonies, in addition to various other public and private events celebrating the history, government, and traditions of the United States. Independence Day is the National Day of the United States

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the Thirteen Colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia declaring the United States independent from Great Britain. [4][5] After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail:

The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more. Adams's prediction was off by two days. From the outset, Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress.^[7]

Independence on July 4, even though Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin all later wrote that they had signed it on that day. In a remarkable coincidence, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the only signers of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as Presidents of the United States, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Although not a signer of the Declaration of Independence, but another Founding Father who became a President, James Monroe, died on July 4, 1831, thus becoming the third President in a row who died on this memorable day. Calvin Coolidge, the 30th President, was born on July 4, 1872, and, so far, is the only President to have been born on Independence Day.

Observance

In 1777, thirteen gunshots were fired in salute, once at morning and once

St. Robert's Parish Hall KofC Rosary - 7:00 PM Business Mtg. - 7:30 PM (Refreshments following the Meeting) again as evening fell, on July 4 in Bristol, Rhode Island. for the Continental Congress, toasts, 13-gun salutes, speeches, prayers, music, parades, troop reviews, and fireworks. Ships were decked with red, white, and blue bunting.^[13]

In 1778, General George Washington marked July 4 with a double ration of rum for his soldiers and an artillery salute.

In 1779, July 4 fell on a Sunday. The holiday was celebrated on Monday, July 5. [14]

In 1781 the Massachusetts General Court became the first state legislature to recognize July 4 as a state celebration. [14]

In 1783, Moravians in Salem, North Carolina, held a celebration of July 4 with a challenging music program assembled by Johann Friedrich Peter. This work was titled "The Psalm of Joy." This is recognized as the first recorded celebration and is still celebrated there today.^[15]

In 1791 the first recorded use of the name "Independence Day" occurred. [citation needed]

In 1870, the U.S. Congress made Independence Day an unpaid holiday for federal employees. [16]

In 1938, Congress changed Independence Day to a paid federal holiday. [17]





Independence Day fireworks are often accompanied by patriotic songs such as the national anthem "The Star-Spangled Banner", "God Bless America", "America the Beautiful", "My Country, 'Tis of Thee", "This Land Is Your Land", "Stars and Stripes Forever", and, regionally, "Yankee Doodle" in northeastern states and "Dixie" in southern states. Some of the lyrics recall images of the Revolutionary War or the War of 1812

A salute of one gun for each state in the United States, called a "salute to the union," is fired on Independence Day at noon by any capable military base.

Directions:

- 1. Depart from St. Roberts going south on 7
- 2. At Harrisonville proceed straight to U.S. 49. Go under the bridge and make a left.
- 3. You are going south on 49.
- 4. The first exit past Archie is AA (exit 144) make a right onto AA.
- 5. Immediately go left onto the service road.
- 6. Go 1/2 a mile and make a right onto the gravel road. Go 2.4 miles to my cabin. (You will cross rail road tracks after 1/2 a mile and then cross another gravel road at .4 miles--continue straight and you will find that the road makes a sharp left turn, continue for.8 miles and you are there.)

The total trip is about 45 miles and takes just under one hour. My cabin is on the hill behind the large pond. There are three red roof buildings. The drive takes you over the damn of my pond.

Thanks to Wendell Vice, we now have found a local company, R&R Buttons, that will provide our KofC "dress shirts".
