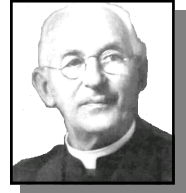

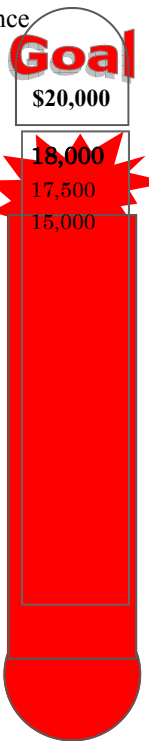

After a few minutes, a friend nudged and tried to awaken him but he was incoherent and unable to speak. A retired doctor in the room performed a preliminary examination and asked for the rescue squad to be summoned. He was transported to an ER and is now fine. This was a reminder that we should all remain vigilant for these little health problems. As retired senior citizens we are particularly vulnerable to emergency health problems.
