
WELCOME TO ST MARY FATHER JOHN

The article reprinted below is from the church bulletin of St Peter and Paul Church in Naperville of June 30, 2013. Father Lovitsch is being reassigned to St Mary as our Parochial Vicar after a year at St Peter and Paul. Father Lovitsch has a great history and comes to us from a truly great parish. Father Lovitsch will arrive on June 18. Welcome Father John!

WELCOME FR. JOHN LOVITSCH

I am Fr. John Lovitsch, a recent alumnus of the Pontifical North American College and I am happy to be the new associate at Sts. Peter and Paul here in Naperville. In my life, my faith has taken me places that I would never have expected to go. I was born a Catholic, baptized, made my first confession, and received my first holy communion at St. Isaac Jogues Parish in Hinsdale but it was after that my family, which has now returned to the Catholic Church, began to go to a non-denominational Protestant Bible church. It was there, though, God worked through me to grow deeper in the Scriptures and the love of my faith. I grew up in Hinsdale playing baseball, running track, and camping. It was during middle school that I began to attend a Protestant service.

However, in high school at Hinsdale Central, I was placed in the same physics class as someone who took his Catholic faith and lived it out. Ryan and I would talk about the Faith and he would challenge me to grow in my faith and develop my knowledge of Christianity. It was there that I began to see the incompleteness of the Protestant thought I was carrying. I was wondering why we did not attend church every day and began to see the fundamental difference between the Protestant communities and the Catholic Church: the Eucharist.



Long story short, I returned to the Catholic Church and my parents came with. I was confirmed later than most by the then -bishop of Joliet, the Most Reverend J. Peter Sartain at the Cathedral in Joliet on Pentecost Sunday. Since that turbulent time in my life of going back-and-forth with my faith and having my world shaken and changed by Christ for the better, God has taken me places I would have never expected to go. I began college at Indiana University studying at the Kelly School of Business, then I left and went to Wheaton College, but it was still not where I would end up. During my junior year of college at Wheaton, I went to St. John Vianney College Seminary in St. Paul Minnesota after being accepted as a diocesan seminarian for Joliet.

After my time studying in Minnesota, I was sent to Rome for my theology studies. At the North American College in Rome I could not have been happier studying alongside the men of the United States under the care and guidance of some of the best priests the American Church has to offer. I began my studies at the Gregorian University under the care of the Jesuits but finished at the University of St. Thomas Aquinas where I was instructed by the Dominicans. After my first academic year in Rome, I was blessed to be able to stay with the Coptic Catholic Seminarians in Egypt and teach them English. It was there where I was able to see and experience the full breadth of the life of the Church in another country where the members are suppressed and struggling under oppression. I returned home for the first time after two years in Rome and was on assignment as a seminarian at Sacred Heart in Lombard. There I grew in my love for the diocese and the diocesan priesthood. It was a blessed summer in so many ways. I was ordained a deacon on June 2, 2012 by the imposition of hands and prayer of His Excellency R. Daniel Conlon, Bishop of the Diocese of Joliet. I was at St. Walter parish in Roselle as a deacon during the summer between my third and fourth year.

After my fourth and final year of academic studies in Rome, I returned to the diocese and was ordained a priest by Bishop Conlon on May 18, 2013. For the next few years I look forward to serving at this parish as a priest. Yes, God has taken me places I never expected to go and some are rough, some are smooth; some are pleasant and some not, but God has been there always and that is what I can count on. Be assured of my prayers for everyone in this parish and please pray for me as I begin my life as a priest.

Frank Borich


