Open Council Officer Positions

We still have the following officer vacancies for the upcoming fraternal year.

1. Chancellor: The Chancellor is the third ranking officer within the council. If the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight are unable to perform their duties due to absence or incapacitation, the Chancellor assumes those duties until such time as the Grand Knight or his deputy are able. The Chancellors main function is to assist the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight in any capacity requested or required, however the Chancellor is expected to pay special

In those councils that support and sponsor a seminarian, the Chancellor is responsible for all correspondence between the council and the seminarian.
