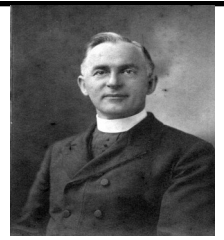

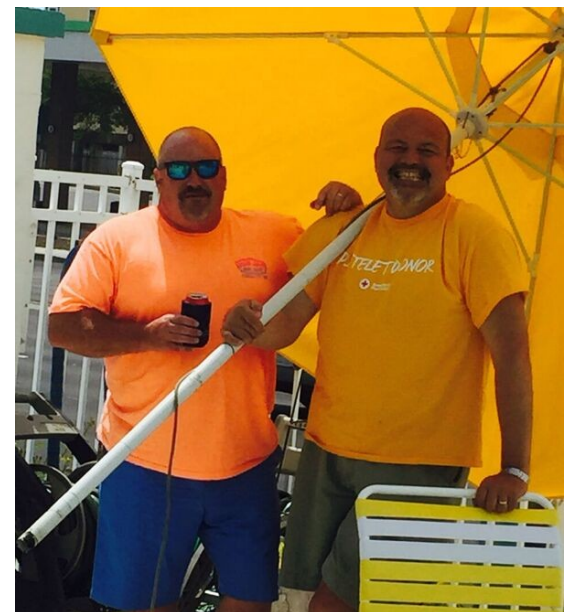
KEGLERS ALLEY
