June is the apex of this wonderful Easter time with the solemnity of Pentecost. The church instructs us to pray the Prayer of the Holy Spirit to prepare our hearts, body and mind to receive the beautiful gifts of the Holy Spirit.

SAGRADA FAMILIA TEMPLE: A WORK OF GENIUS

"God's Architect" – the nickname given to one of the most gifted architects in human history -Antoni Gaudi. His Sagrada Familia Catholic Church in Barcelona, Spain, is his" unfinished masterpiece." Due to be finished in 2026, this

unusual structure and iconoclastic style was created by Gaudi as a spiritual gift to God and Nature.

What makes it different and majestic? Several elements conceived by this master:

The finished height will be approximately 564 ft. at the highest tower. But the support for this height does not come from the traditional exterior buttress elements as in Gothic cathedrals. The support comes from the unusual interior columns and cables internal to the stone. The columns spread out from the "trunk" into "branches" of stone that support multiple roof loads. Thus, the interior is like a forest of trees. This pays homage to nature, God's creation.

The exterior has three facades: Nativity, Crucifixion, and Resurrection. Each has four towers which taken together represent the 12 apostles. Each façade is covered with figures and symbols of the event. The Nativity façade has three Portals: The Portal of Hope, The Portal of Mercy and The Portal of Faith. They are sculpted from the death masks of deceased Barcelona citizens who worked on the church; Gaudi's way of paying homage to them for their contribution.

The interior light comes into the "forest" through high clear glass at the "tree tops." Then the lower walls have stained glass. On the Nativity side, the stained glass is blue and green, conveying peace and tranquility while on the Crucifixion side the glass is bright red and bright orange, transmitting violence and angst.

There is no concrete ; the structure is all stone. Christ crucified on the façade does not have the customary hanging head; his head is a book - Christ is portrayed as an open book.

These are just a few of the unique elements of this magnificent work. The work is as unusual as the life of its "creator" who never married, who gave his life from 1883 until his death in 1926 to this "child." He did not create using drawings, he built complex three-dimension models of hanging weights to observe the reaction of the model as weights were added to the hanging strings representing the loads to be carried. Seven of his works in Barcelona have been declared World Heritage Sites by UNESCO.

Finally, this humble genius came to an end when he was hit by a tram and because of his disheveled appearance he was mistaken for a homeless tramp and was not properly cared for. He died three days later on June 10, 1926. **Deputy Grand Knight's Corner**

And just like that, another year has passed us by. A year of hardships, challenges and losses of loved ones. A year of camaraderie, friendships made or renewed, of volunteerism and dedication to charity. In other words, another year of being a Rosensteel Council Brother Knight, or Maryknight or Mary's Widow.

The leadership exemplified by our GK Terrence Moore has been inspirational to work with, and aspirational in setting the tone for the year ahead. Our fraternal organization came together and functioned as a team. We saw new faces at volunteer events, young men choosing to become knights, a surge in attendance at our events. We were blessed to have Fr. Ettore Ferrario's spiritual guidance shepherd us in our journey to be Christ like. And as these two leaders leave their roles, I'd like to ask you, my Brother Knights, to reach out and thank them for their service to us. We've survived our challenges and remain blessed and purposeful thanks to their guidance. We are Rosensteel Proud.
