William Daniel Johnson, my father, died this past March, the day before Palm Sunday. His favorite song, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus," was always the mainstay of love for him. My dad, in the context of faith, taught me to engage life fully, and to value love. GK Chesterton once said, "To love means loving the unlovable. To forgive means pardoning the unpardonable. Faith means believing the unbelievable. Hope means hoping when everything seems hopeless." These three components of love are lessons learned in family life. They are foundational to Catholic Christian life and are pillars of the Knights of Columbus. The role of the Knight is incredibly important in the family and in the world. We are called by our credo and our Catholic faith to bring healing through love. Pope Francis encourages us to seek out the marginalized and the forgotten. Unconditional love is the journey of a lifetime. The example of Jesus, "Christ emptied himself, taking the form of a slave," when he stripped away everything and took on the posture of slave it reminds each of us of the power of humility. When we are able to separate ourselves from pride, we become as Christ. The result is always that of healing. Edith Stein says that we are able through the gifts of the Holy Spirit to change people. She says, "The love with which I embrace a human being may be sufficient to fill him with new life power if his own breaks down. Indeed, the mere contact with human beings of more intense aliveness may exert an enlivening effect upon those who are jaded or exhausted, who have no activeness as a presupposition on their sided."

Our earthly fathers prepare us for Christian existence as disciples of Jesus. We learn that we have the capacity to channel the love of our heavenly Father to the world. The ability to give and forgive in the context of love stands to enhance our ministry and vocation as parent, and as a Knight of Columbus. As a result the liberation that we experience is transferred to those whom we love and teach to love. The divine faith that fuels our love of God and neighbor becomes the vision of hope. Dad you were right, "What a friend we have in Jesus."

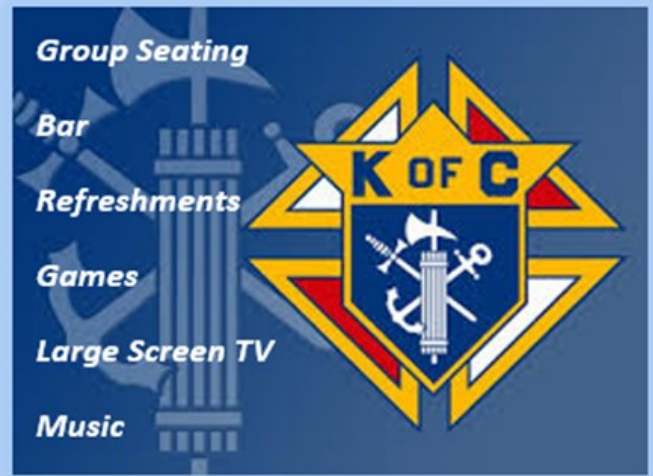
