From the Vermont State Deputy



Brother Knights,

We are now in June. The last month of the Fraternal Year. How is your Council doing? Are you in great shape for receive the Columbian Award, McGivney Award, Founders Award, or Star Council Award? How well did your programs go this year? I hope and pray that your programs went extremely well and that you are in great shape to receive one of the Awards.

Let's talk recruiting. As of June 2nd, we have brought in 52 new members for the Fraternal Year. We are not quite half-way to the goal Supreme set for Vermont. I want to give you some information I received the other day. Vermont's intake goal for the 2018-2019 Fraternal Year is 125 new members. We currently stand at 52. Vermont's 5-year average (not including 2018-2019) has been 97 new members. Vermont's 2-year average (again not including 2018-2019) has been 105 new members. The biggest reason for the low numbers this year is that 50% of the active Council's in Vermont have not recruited this year. We are talking approximately 20 Councils have not recruited this year. Why? You and I know there are men in our Parishes that are not members and they should be. Why haven't we asked them to join? What is holding us up from doing so? I hope we are not thinking that "oh someone else will ask him". It doesn't hurt to ask these men to join. I was speaking with a gentleman today at a dinner about joining. As we were talking, I found he wasn't a Knight, so I asked him if anyone had ever asked him if he wanted to join. He said no one ever asked.



Well, 2 of us asked him today. He is interested and I believe we will get him to join this month. All of this took place in about 5 minutes. It doesn't take long. We ended up talking for a while, he had questions about the Knights, which were easily answered and I mentioned to him that a lot more information could be found online at www.kofc.org. We all know how to recruit. We all have stories we can share to these men as to what it means to us to be a Knight. Stories about the programs we have worked on and the fun times we have had doing them. The friends we have made in the Knights and the friendships that will last a lifetime. Share these stories with potential new members, you will be surprised at how many will join. New members do not mean more men in the Council. It means more programs can be done. It means our current programs can be expanded. We can accomplish more charitable works.

Just a quick note that the Installation of State Officers and District Deputies will be held on Sunday July 21st at St. Joseph's Cathedral. We are looking for a Council or Council's to host the BBQ following the Installation. His Excellency, Bishop Coyne has offered the use of the Rectory lawn for the BBQ. If you and your Council would like to host the BBQ, please let myself or State Secretary Steve Shover know. We are still going to be doing the pilgrimage to St. Anne's Shrine. That will be on Saturday July 27th. More information will be sent out regarding both of these as the dates draw closer.

I would like to offer thanks on behalf of the State Officers as well. We thank you for the trust you have put in us and we are looking forward to working with you all this coming Fraternal Year.

In closing let us finish this Fraternal Year with a bang and start the next Fraternal Year with an even bigger bang.

VERMONT DISTRICT MASTER

Worthy Sir Knights,

This past week-end we celebrated Memorial Day. Although a day of rest and enjoyment let us NEVER forget this day is also known as "Decoration Day". A day to decorate the graves of our fallen servicemen and women in remembrance of their unselfish sacrifice and freedom they upheld for our Nation. Let us also remember June 14th, Flag Day, and the 244th Birthday of our U. S. Army. Be proud and honored to show our patriotic support - DISPLAY THE FLAG.

What I am about to write is strictly my opinion and do not necessarily represent the views of the Knights of Columbus:

Our Order is under attack and it is being done blatantly in front of us. However, this has not been the 1st and doubt it will be the last. Excerpts of what I write are taken from the manuscript, *Patriotism and Fraternalism in the Knights of Columbus: A History of the Fourth Degree* written by Christopher J. Kauffman, copyright@2001 by the Knights of Columbus pp 3-25. We know Venerable Michael McGivney founded the Order due to civil rights on the political respect due to those sharing the *Catholic* faith of our name sake, Christopher Columbus. The choice of Columbus as our patron was based on the Catholic notion of civil liberty. An early Knight of the Order noted that the ceremonials were in part “exemplification of the life and work of our patron.” He continued and stated “let us live, not as bubbles on the waves, which when bursted [sic], vanish and leave no trace of their existence, but rather in the language of our ritual: “let us live for those who love us, for those we know are true; for the heavens that smile upon us, and the good that we do.” The term Knight conveyed a commitment to struggle against anti-Catholicism not as bitter militants on the offensive but as “Catholic gentlemen in fraternity.” Our ceremonial dramatizes our Catholic contributions to the making of America with particular attention to Christopher Columbus who was viewed as the prototype of the struggle for liberty. Originally there were only 2 holidays when Fourth Degree initiations, or exemplifications, could be held: George Washington’s Birthday and Columbus Day.

With the Fourth-Degree current membership in Vermont at 1112 and the Third-Degree at 3696, our love for our Order and its patron namesake, are being again attacked with Vermont recently signing a bill to replace Columbus Day with Indigenous Peoples’ Day. Opposition to Columbus Day dates back to at least the 19th century, when anti-immigrant nativists (Know Nothings) sought to eliminate its celebration because of its association with [immigrants](#) from the [Catholic](#) countries of Ireland and Italy, and the American Catholic fraternal organization, the [Knights of Columbus](#). Although an amendment was proposed to establish a separate holiday, the amendment failed. Representative Robin Chestnut-Tangerman explained her vote for the record: “Two thoughts: One, history is not objective. It is written by the victors. In writing our history we have erred grievously. Two, [when you make a mistake, admit it, correct it, and move on](#). We are doing that today.” Yes, I also believe in her statement, “when you make a mistake, admit it, correct it, and move on”, but I fail to see where a mistake was made. Our Patron name and holiday were based on our Catholic notion of civil liberty for all and Columbus’ faith beliefs. I fail to see how “Columbus Day” was taking away the rights and respect due any and all indigenous people, it celebrates his arrival in the Americas. In re-writing our state history our state congress has erred grievously by removing the recognition of a federal holiday. Where is the danger of including another day of recognition?



Brothers, your presences at parades, wakes, funerals, Parish feast and Holy days, First Communions, Confirmations, Graduations, Special Olympic functions, etc.... have all made your Assemblies proud.

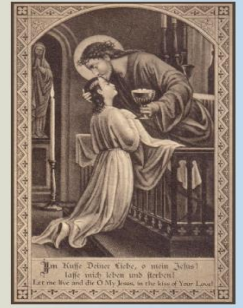

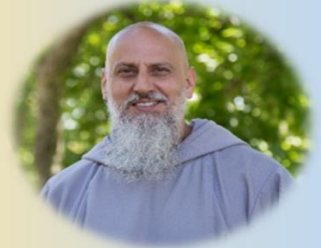

The New **VERMONT STATE DIRECTORY** is Coming!

According to the Supreme Council bylaws *all* Councils and Assemblies *must* hold elections of officers between May 1 and June 15 each year.

That's good, since it will give the Grand Knight or Financial Secretary of your Council and the Faithful Navigator or Comptroller of your Assembly plenty of time to get the Directory Information to the State Secretary and me so that the Directory can be in the hands of those who need it before not having it starts to cause problems.

It should be absolutely possible to have the new State Directory out to everyone who is supposed to have one by early- to mid-July, since we are no longer required to professionally print hundreds of copies of the Directory, pick them up, address and mail them to the recipients. Imagine having the correct contact information at the very start of the new year. How great will that be?

Well, to get the ball rolling on the new Directory I am providing copies of the forms [HERE](#) which the Councils and Assemblies need to submit so that State Officers, District Deputies, and various Directors and Chairmen can reach them (you) with *important* and *timely* information. The sooner, after your election of Officers, that this information is sent to us, the sooner the Directory will be done and in the necessary hands.

“Why,” you may be wondering, “when all this information is provided to Supreme, do the Councils and Assemblies need to also submit this information to the State Council?” The quick answer is that NOT ALL this information is provided to Supreme, nor does Supreme routinely provide the information which the Councils and Assemblies send them on to the State Council. In a word, if the Councils and Assemblies do not provide this information to us, we won't have it. Therefore, please send it, and soon.

Finally, let me do us all a favor. If the officers and priests involved have not changed after the election of officers, just write in the Council or Assembly Number and then right “SAME” in the space for the officer or priest. If there are any changes in his contact information write that in the appropriate space. And please make sure that the information provided is correct. I have enough problems with my own type-o's!

Thanks. And let's get this done!

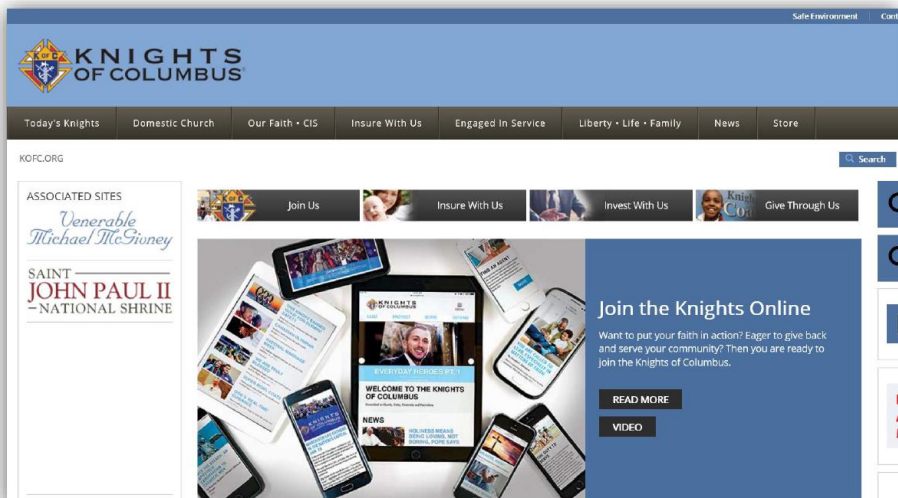
