Chaplain's Reflection Physical Resurrection of Christ

After the Resurrection, Christ reveals himself to His disciples through the "breaking of the bread." They immediately recognized Jesus because He was reenacting His defining actions from the Last Supper. These actions would have meant something only to those who were with Him at the Last Supper.

Jesus invites His disciples to feel his glorified risen body and to see that He really does have human flesh and bones, and he even eats some baked fish. Thus, the Gospels absolutely affirm that Jesus did physically resurrect from the dead. Jesus was not a ghost or a mirage or a vision. For the disciples, "seeing was believing." However, for those of us that were not there we must rely on faith and the testimony of eyewitnesses.

Over the centuries, many skeptics have tried to make the case that a physical resurrection could not have possibly occurred. These claims are broadly based on the idea that there are no corroborating secular accounts of the Resurrection. However, as Father John Meier has researched in "A Marginal Jew," there is really no reason that the Resurrection would have been of note to the historians of the time.

Jesus lived in a small backwater of the Roman Empire, far removed from its seat in Rome. And as the Gospels have noted, Jesus limited His post-resurrection appearances to a subset of those who had known Him prior to the Crucifixion. Jesus did not appear to anyone outside of his closest disciples.

Josephus was a first century Jewish historian who wrote "The Jewish Antiquities" about 20 years after the composition of the Gospels. Scholars believe that the brief accounts of the crucifixion of Jesus and the beheading of John the Baptist were originally written by Josephus. So there is secular confirmation that Jesus and John the Baptist were real people.

There is also a passage in "The Jewish

Antiquities" describing Jesus as "appearing on the third day, living again." But most scholars believe that this passage was inserted later by Christian copiers and translators. So the only authentic accounts of the Resurrection are in the Gospels.

Still, it is undeniable that something happened three days after that crucifixion and death. The tomb was empty. The body was gone. Jesus was alive again.

So why should we believe in the veracity of the resurrection accounts two millennia later? First, I find the first witnesses of that event to be credible people. It is very clear from the Gospels that the early followers of Jesus did not always believe in him while he was alive. So why would they suddenly put their faith in a dead man? And their faith in Jesus, alive again, did not win them honor, prestige or fame. It brought them persecution, rejection, dishonor and ultimately exile and death.

Also recent scholarship reveals that there were many other people similar to Jesus at that time. There were miracle workers, magicians as they were called then, some of them even claimed to be the Messiah. Yet, we know nothing about any of them.

So there had to be something different about this Jesus, something as wonderful as rising from the dead, for him to have died with virtually no followers and now 2,000 years later, to have over a billion followers worldwide.

Second, I believe in God's ultimate triumph, in the ultimate victory of God's will, because it is the only belief that gives meaning to life. If there is no life after death, then life has no meaning. All that we learn, accomplish and achieve would be obliterated by our death.

"Seeing is believing" is how most of us approach life. But "believing is seeing" is how the believer approaches life. Faith gives us a lens, a way to view life, a way to trust the basic goodness of life. Faith is God's gift, and God will give faith to those who honestly searches for it, by opening themselves to His gracious presence.
