From the Vermont State Deputy



Worthy Brother Knights,

IMPORTANT DATES:

Firstly, our District Deputy Organizational meeting will be held on Saturday, June 26, 2021 from 8:30 am till Noon. We will have a representative from Supreme at this meeting, so would appreciate 100% participation. Speaking of District Deputies, we are still in need of replacements for Moe Noel and Elijah LaChance. Moe is stepping down after many years of faithful service and Elijah is now the State Advocate.

If you know of anyone who would be willing to take on these responsibilities, please let the current DD and myself know. The form is due to Supreme by June 1st, so we need to act quickly on this and I do not want to send in the form with blank spaces. Thank you.

"Vermont Knights for Life" began in January 2020 as an initiative of the Vermont State Council, making good on our pledge to buy a van for Aspire Together's mobile ultrasound program aspirations. I was also happy to produce by our efforts, in 2020, posters and publicity for all the Pro-Life centers and clinics in the state. The date "2020" was originally attached to this program, but now we can pray that an appropriate legacy can be made for many years to come.

The State Council has already reached its ultrasound van fundraising goal for "Vermont Knights for Life." This is old news, but we still rejoice in it, and thank all the local councils that pitched in generously from their council funds. The intended mobile ultrasound program is moving forward, despite so many logistical hurdles and delays over the past 18 months. We expect that it be August or September before the Supreme Council donates for the ultrasound machine to equip the mobile clinic when it become fully equipped. Please remember that with RSVP, Knights provide more than financial support; members write letters to the seminarians or postulants, sponsor dinners for them, invite them to join the council and, most importantly, pray for vocations.

I ask that all of our councils work with me as your State Vocations Director to ensure the proper and complete implementation of the RSVP program to ensure that every seminarian sponsored by the diocese is included in the RSVP program.


