Roman Monstrance

This monstrance was presented to the Knights of Columbus by the Holy See as a tribute to the organization's loyalty. The vessel is used to present the Eucharist for public view, most often during the rite of exposition and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The name derives from the Latin term meaning "to show" or "to display," and originated in the 14th century in France and Germany.



Pentecost and Discipleship



You may have noticed that our prayer this month asks Jesus Christ to "pour out His Holy Spirit on St. Mary Magdalene Parish for spiritual renewal" and to help each of us "develop a personal relationship with Him as our Lord and Redeemer". Giving yourself to Jesus Christ will change your life. Reflecting on John 20:19-23, the Gospel we heard recently on Pentecost Sunday, I tried to relate discipleship to the 12 Apostles. These were the men who were closest to Jesus during his public ministry and knew Him best. As I reflected, I recalled how confident and effective the Apostles were in spreading God's word "to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). They showed extreme courage in the face of danger. Each one of the Apostles was persecuted and ultimately martyred because of their personal relationship with Jesus. What wonderful examples of discipleship!

In the gospel we heard on Pentecost, however, we saw a much different picture of the Apostles. We saw them huddled in fear behind closed doors. They had just seen Jesus brutally crucified by the Jews and they were afraid that if they were recognized as His followers, they would meet the same fate. They had lost all hope and their spirits were destroyed. They were afraid that their "personal relationship with Jesus Christ" would get them killed. They were afraid of death and were not at peace. Fear destroys peace.


And what is the first thing Jesus says to them as he "stood in their midst"? He says "Peace be with you" and showed them the wounds of His crucifixion. Again He says to them "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you" and he gave them the Holy Spirit, giving the Apostles the mission of discipleship.

These 12 men, who were once huddled together in fear, were now men of courage proclaiming their personal relationship with Jesus Christ as Lord and Redeemer to the world.

Like the Apostles, very often in our lives we are locked in by our own fear. We also experience pain, suffering, and sorrow. As we know, Jesus also experienced pain, suffering, sorrow and fear. Since he is fully human as well as fully divine, he knows what we're going through and just like in his personal relationship with the Apostles, He is constantly "in our midst" proclaiming to each of us "Peace be with you". By having a personal relationship with Jesus, the joy of His presence touches us as it touched the Apostles on Pentecost. He breathes on us as he breathed on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit", the Spirit of the wounded and risen Jesus who gives us new life, strengthens us in our struggles, and gives us courageous hearts that are no longer locked in fear behind closed doors.

By developing a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as our Lord and Redeemer, our lives will be changed. The very essence of the Holy Trinity is Love, and, love casts out and conquers all fear. "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us and your Church the fire of your Love". "Help each of us develop a personal relationship with You as our Lord and Redeemer. Form us into the disciples You want us to be".








Special Thanks To All Who Came Out Thursday,







*All of these titles refer to the same individual named Mary, the mother of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (in the <u>New Testament</u>) and are used variably by <u>Roman Catholics</u>, <u>Eastern Orthodox</u>, <u>Oriental Orthodox</u>, and some <u>Anglicans</u>. (Note: <u>Mary Magdalene</u>, <u>Mary of Clopas</u>, and <u>Mary Salome</u>are different individuals from Mary, mother of Jesus.) Many of the titles given to Mary are <u>dogmatic</u> in nature.

<u>Mary is known by many different titles</u> (Blessed Mother, Virgin, Madonna, Our Lady), <u>epithets</u> (<u>Star of the Sea</u>, <u>Queen of Heaven</u>, Cause of Our Joy), invocations (<u>Theotokos</u>, <u>Panagia</u>, Mother of Mercy) and other names (<u>Our Lady of Loreto</u>, <u>Our Lady of Guadalupe</u>).






